## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), entitled "An act providing for planning for the processing and disposal of municipal waste; requiring counties to submit 2 3 4 plans for municipal waste management systems within their boundaries; authorizing grants to counties and municipalities 6 for planning, resource recovery and recycling; imposing and 7 collecting fees; establishing certain rights for host 8 municipalities; requiring municipalities to implement 9 recycling programs; requiring Commonwealth agencies to procure recycled materials; imposing duties; granting powers 10 to counties and municipalities; authorizing the Environmental 11 12 Quality Board to adopt regulations; authorizing the 13 Department of Environmental Resources to implement this act; providing remedies; prescribing penalties; establishing a 14 15 fund; and making repeals, " providing for recycling at 16 recreational facilities. 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 18 19 Section 1. The act of July 28, 1988 (P.L.556, No.101), known 20 as the Municipal Waste Planning, Recycling and Waste Reduction 21 Act, is amended by adding a section to read: 22 Section 1509.1. Recycling at recreational facilities. 23 (a) General rule. -- All recreational facilities shall

establish and implement a source-separation and collection

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- 1 program for recyclable materials produced as a result of
- 2 recreational facility events, including, at a minimum, aluminum
- 3 and glass. The source-separation and collection program shall
- 4 <u>include</u>, at a minimum, procedures for collecting and storing
- 5 recyclable materials and bins or containers for storing
- 6 <u>materials</u>.
- 7 (b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term
- 8 <u>"recreational facilities" shall include stadiums, arenas, civic</u>
- 9 <u>centers and convention centers having an available seating</u>
- 10 capacity of 4,000 or more.
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
