AN ACT

Amending the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), entitled 2 "An act concerning elections, including general, municipal, special and primary elections, the nomination of candidates, 3 primary and election expenses and election contests; creating 4 5 and defining membership of county boards of elections; 6 imposing duties upon the Secretary of the Commonwealth, courts, county boards of elections, county commissioners; 7 imposing penalties for violation of the act, and codifying, 8 9 revising and consolidating the laws relating thereto; and repealing certain acts and parts of acts relating to 10 elections, " providing for declarations of intent. 11 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 The act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known 15 as the Pennsylvania Election Code, is amended by adding a 16 section to read: 17 Section 906.1. Declaration of Intent--(a) A candidate must, 18 within five (5) days prior to the date specified in section 913(d), file with the Secretary of the Commonwealth a signed 19 declaration of intent to seek nomination in the form prescribed 20 by the secretary if the candidate seeks party nomination for any 21

22 of the following offices:

- 1 (1) Governor.
- 2 (2) Lieutenant Governor.
- 3 <u>(3) Treasurer.</u>
- 4 (4) Auditor General.
- 5 (5) Attorney General.
- 6 (6) Senator in the General Assembly.
- 7 (7) Representative in the General Assembly.
- 8 (b) If an incumbent fails to comply with subsection (a), the
- 9 time period specified in subsection (a) shall be extended up to
- 10 the date specified in section 913(d) for a candidate other than
- 11 the incumbent.
- 12 (c) If a candidate fails to comply with this section, the
- 13 secretary shall refuse to accept the nominating petition of the
- 14 candidate.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
