- 1 Amending Title 23 (Domestic Relations) of the Pennsylvania
 - Consolidated Statutes, further providing for protection from
- 3 abuse definitions and relief.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:

- 6 Section 1. The definition of "abuse" in section 6102(a) of
- 7 Title 23 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended
- 8 and the subsection is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 9 § 6102. Definitions.
- 10 (a) General rule. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 11 in this chapter shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 12 section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Abuse." The occurrence of one or more of the following acts
- 14 between family or household members, sexual or intimate
- 15 partners, persons engaged in a substantive dating relationship
- 16 or persons who share biological parenthood:

- 1 (1) Attempting to cause or intentionally, knowingly or
- 2 recklessly causing bodily injury, serious bodily injury,
- 3 rape, involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, sexual assault,
- 4 statutory sexual assault, aggravated indecent assault,
- 5 indecent assault or incest with or without a deadly weapon.
- 6 (2) Placing another in reasonable fear of imminent
- 7 serious bodily injury.
- 8 (3) The infliction of false imprisonment pursuant to 18
- 9 Pa.C.S. § 2903 (relating to false imprisonment).
- 10 (4) Physically or sexually abusing minor children,
- including such terms as defined in Chapter 63 (relating to
- 12 child protective services).
- 13 (5) Knowingly engaging in a course of conduct or
- repeatedly committing acts toward another person, including
- following the person, without proper authority, under
- circumstances which place the person in reasonable fear of
- 17 bodily injury. The definition of this paragraph applies only
- 18 to proceedings commenced under this title and is inapplicable
- 19 to any criminal prosecutions commenced under Title 18
- 20 (relating to crimes and offenses).

- 22 "Persons engaged in a substantive dating relationship."
- 23 Persons found by the court to be currently or fairly recently
- 24 engaged in a relationship:
- 25 (1) in which there is possible sexual attraction for
- 26 <u>either party;</u>
- 27 (2) which has been ongoing for a substantial period of
- 28 <u>time; and</u>
- 29 (3) in which there was reasonably frequent interaction
- 30 between the parties.

- 2 Section 2. Section 6108(a) of Title 23 is amended by adding
- 3 a paragraph to read:
- 4 § 6108. Relief.
- 5 (a) General rule. -- The court may grant any protection order
- 6 or approve any consent agreement to bring about a cessation of
- 7 abuse of the plaintiff or minor children. The order or agreement
- 8 may include:
- 9 * * *
- 10 (9.1) Directing the defendant to participate in a
- 11 program of counseling or therapy.

- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
