- 1 (2) The Commonwealth has an obligation to provide
- 2 protection against loss of facilities, equipment and lives by
- 3 fire or other disasters on the premises of the universities
- 4 of the system.
- 5 (3) It is more efficient and economically sound for any
- 6 university of the system to enter into agreements with
- 7 existing emergency service providers in adjacent
- 8 municipalities for essential services such as POLICE, fire, <—

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- 9 ambulance and rescue squads., CODE ENFORCEMENT AND RESCUE <--

- 11 Section 3. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given them in this section unless the context
- 14 clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Chancellor." The chancellor of the State System of Higher
- 16 Education.
- 17 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic
- 18 Development of the Commonwealth.
- 19 "Emergency service provider." A local law enforcement agency <---
- 20 or volunteer fire, ambulance or rescue squad or company.
- 21 "HOST MUNICIPALITY." A MUNICIPALITY WHEREIN A UNIVERSITY IS <---
- 22 LOCATED.
- 23 "SERVICES." INCLUDES POLICE, FIRE, AMBULANCE, CODE
- 24 ENFORCEMENT AND RESCUE SERVICES.
- 25 "System." The State System of Higher Education.
- 26 "University." A member institution of the State System of
- 27 Higher Education.
- 28 Section 4. Agreements authorized.
- 29 Each university may enter into agreements with emergency
- 30 service providers A HOST MUNICIPALITY to provide emergency <—

1 services to their campuses. The total amount payable by any 2 university in the system for the provision of emergency services

pursuant to agreements entered into under this section may not

- 4 exceed the limits established in section 5.
- 5 Section 5. Computation of limits for payments.
- 6 (a) Annual computation and certification. -- Each university
- 7 in the system shall annually compute and certify to the
- 8 chancellor the on-campus, full-time equivalent enrollment AND <-
- 9 PART-TIME ENROLLMENT, INCLUDING GRADUATE AND NONTRADITIONAL, as
- 10 of the third full week of classes for the spring FALL term. The <-
- 11 enrollment figure thereby determined shall be multiplied by \$5,
- 12 and the resulting product shall be the maximum amount the
- 13 university may expend for emergency services, pursuant to
- 14 agreements entered into under this act, for the next ensuing
- 15 fiscal year.

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- 16 (b) Verification by chancellor. -- The chancellor shall verify
- 17 the figures submitted and forward the figures to the department
- 18 which will reimburse each university for its actual expenditures
- 19 for emergency services, within the limits established under this
- 20 section, with funds specifically appropriated annually by the
- 21 General Assembly for this purpose.
- 22 Section 6. Certification of operating expenses by emergency <
- 23 service providers HOST MUNICIPALITIES.
- 24 Each emergency service provider HOST MUNICIPALITY who is
- 25 party to an agreement with a university of the system as
- 26 authorized by this act shall annually submit a complete
- 27 certified report of its operating expenses for the year for
- 28 which the payments were made. The department shall prescribe the
- 29 exact contents and filing date for the report.
- 30 Section 7. Provision of legal services to emergency service

- 1 providers HOST MUNICIPALITIES.
- 2 In any legal action arising out of or in connection with any
- 3 services performed on behalf of any university of the system by
- 4 the emergency service provider HOST MUNICIPALITY with respect to <-

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- 5 State facilities or premises, the Commonwealth, out of funds
- 6 appropriated to the university system, shall reimburse the
- 7 emergency service provider HOST MUNICIPALITY for the cost
- 8 incurred by it in defending the legal action. In any such legal
- 9 action, the emergency service provider HOST MUNICIPALITY shall <
- 10 be reimbursed for 50% of the total costs, up to a maximum of
- 11 \$5,000. This section shall not be construed to:
- 12 (1) make the Commonwealth liable for any judgment or
- liability resulting in such action by virtue of the service;
- 14 or
- 15 (2) create a right of reimbursement from the
- 16 Commonwealth to the emergency service provider HOST
- MUNICIPALITY with respect to the liability or judgment.
- 18 Section 8. Appropriation.
- The sum of \$500,000, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
- 20 is hereby appropriated to the Department of Community and
- 21 Economic Development to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 22 Section 9. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect July 1, 1999 2000, or immediately, <—
- 24 whichever occurs later.
