7	Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated

10	(a) Offense definedA person who intentionally:
11	(1) places or sets a bomb;
12	(2) causes the placement or setting of a bomb;
13	(3) reports without factual basis of knowledge the
14	existence or potential existence of a bomb; or
15	(4) threatens by any means the placement or setting of a

1	commits an offense under this section. A separate offense shall
2	occur for each placement or setting of a bomb or each threat to

4	(b) PenaltyAn offense under this section shall be graded

б	(1) a misdemeanor of the first degree for a first

10	(c) Emergency response costsIn addition to any fines,
11	fees, costs or restitution provided for by law, the court may
12	order a person convicted under this section to reimburse the
13	State, county or municipal corporation for the costs incurred
14	incident to a bomb threat for emergency response resources
15	reasonably necessary to protect life and property.
16	(d) DefinitionAs used in this section, the term "bomb"
17	means an explosive device used for unlawful purposes.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
