## AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, authorizing immunity for 3 employers who disclose certain information regarding current 4 or former employees. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 8 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read: § 8339.1. Employer immunity relating to disclosure of current 10 or former employee information. An employer who discloses information about a current or 11 former employee's job performance to a prospective employer of 12 13 the current or former employee upon request of the prospective 14 employer or of the current or former employee is presumed to be acting in good faith and, unless lack of good faith is shown by 15 clear and convincing evidence, is immune from civil liability 16

for such disclosure or its consequences. For purposes of this

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- 1 section, the presumption of good faith is rebutted upon a
- 2 showing that the employer disclosed information that:
- 3 <u>(1) the employer knew was false;</u>
- 4 (2) the employer knew was deliberately misleading;
- 5 (3) was rendered with an improper purpose;
- 6 (4) was rendered with reckless disregard as to the truth
- 7 <u>or falsity of the information; or</u>
- 8 (5) violated or interfered with any civil, common law or
- 9 <u>statutory right of the current or former employee.</u>
- 10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
