## AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of December 14, 1988 (P.L.1198, No.148),
- 2 entitled "An act creating a departmental administrative
- 3 commission known as the Animal Health and Diagnostic
- 4 Commission; and establishing a fund, "further providing for
- 5 purpose; providing for definitions; further providing for the
- 6 Animal Health and Diagnostic Commission; and making editorial
- 7 changes.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of December 14, 1988
- 11 (P.L.1198, No.148), known as the Animal Health and Diagnostic
- 12 Act, is amended to read:
- 13 Section 2. Legislative findings and intent.
- 14 Veterinary diagnostic support is the linchpin of any network
- 15 of veterinary epidemic intelligence vital to the maintenance and
- 16 well-being of a modern animal industry. Many diseases have
- 17 potentially serious consequences for animal and human health.
- 18 Much of the research work which is done on animal diseases has a
- 19 correlating effect on human disease research. The General

- 1 Assembly has determined there is a need to facilitate an
- 2 integrated approach to the diagnosis and investigation of
- 3 disease in farm animals. The avian flu virus brought to the
- 4 General Assembly's attention that there is not a laboratory in
- 5 Pennsylvania which can deal with this type of virus, and
- 6 Pennsylvania poultrymen had to send all samples to Ames, Iowa.
- 7 The General Assembly also finds that it is important that there
- 8 be diagnostic capabilities in Pennsylvania since this State is
- 9 one of the top poultry, dairy and animal-producing states in the
- 10 country. There is no doubt that the research laboratories at The
- 11 Pennsylvania State University and the University of Pennsylvania
- 12 teaching facilities are of utmost importance since they
- 13 correlate to the medical facilities at both of these
- 14 universities. To facilitate this program, it is important that
- 15 each diagnostic laboratory be linked together via the Extension
- 16 Computer Network to facilitate an integrated approach to the
- 17 diagnosis and investigation of disease in farm animals. It is
- 18 also the intent of the General Assembly to provide resources and
- 19 a cadre of specialists to allow planned interventions in disease
- 20 outbreaks rather than crisis interventions. A predictable
- 21 funding basis is the only manner in which to achieve these
- 22 necessary laboratory research and diagnostic capabilities. It is
- 23 the intent of the General Assembly to establish a professional
- 24 expert body which advises the Governor and the General Assembly
- 25 <u>in a scientific, nonpartisan mannner regarding the development</u>
- 26 and implementation of animal health policies and programs
- 27 throughout this Commonwealth.
- 28 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 29 <u>Section 2.1 Definitions.</u>
- The following words and phrases when used in this act shall

- 1 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 2 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 3 <u>"Commission." The Animal Health and Diagnostic Commission</u>
- 4 <u>established in section 3.</u>
- 5 <u>"Department." The Department of Agriculture of the</u>
- 6 Commonwealth.
- 7 "Secretary." The Secretary of Agriculture of the
- 8 Commonwealth.
- 9 Section 3. Sections 3, 5 and 6 of the act are amended to
- 10 read:
- 11 Section 3. Creation of commission; members.
- 12 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created in the [Department of
- 13 Agriculture] <u>department</u> a departmental administrative commission
- 14 which shall be known as the Animal Health and Diagnostic
- 15 Commission.
- 16 (b) Membership.--
- 17 (1) The commission shall consist of the following [15]
- 18 19 members:
- 19 (i) The [Secretary of Agriculture of the
- 20 Commonwealth] <u>secretary</u>.
- 21 (ii) The Secretary of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 22 (iii) The chairmen and minority chairmen of the
- 23 Agriculture Committees of both the House of
- 24 Representatives and the Senate.
- 25 (iv) Three accredited veterinarians appointed by the
- 26 Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the
- 27 members elected to the Senate.
- 28 (v) [Six] <u>Four</u> active farmers appointed by the
- 29 Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the
- members elected to the Senate. In appointing farmer

1 members, the Governor shall consider nominees suggested by [Statewide farm organizations, the poultry industry 2 3 and equine and livestock breeding organizations] 4 representative of the agriculture interest groups of this 5 Commonwealth. (vi) One expert in animal nutrition appointed by the 6 Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the 7 members elected to the Senate. In appointing members 8 under this subparagraph, the Governor shall consider 9 nominees suggested by representatives of agriculture 10 11 interests in this Commonwealth. (vii) One expert in animal genetics appointed by the 12 13 Governor with the advice and consent of a majority of the members elected to the Senate. In appointing members 14 under this subparagraph, the Governor shall consider 15 16 nominees suggested by representatives of agriculture 17 interests in this Commonwealth. 18 (viii) Four active farmers, one each appointed by 19 the: 20 (A) President Pro Tempore of the Senate; (B) Majority Leader of the Senate; 21 22 (C) Speaker of the House of Representatives; and 23 (D) Minority Leader of the House of 24 Representatives. 25 The [Secretary of Agriculture] secretary shall serve 26 as the chairman of the commission. At the last regular 27 meeting of the commission in the calendar year, the members of the commission shall elect a vice chairman from among the 28 members of the commission. The member elected vice chairman 29

shall serve in that capacity for the ensuing year.

(3) Each member of the commission in the categories of paragraph (1)[(i) through](ii) and (iii) may be represented by his designee.

- (4) Five of the nine members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed to an initial term of two years. All other members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of four years. A member appointed by the Governor shall hold office until his successor has been duly appointed and qualified according to law but no longer than six months beyond the period to which the member was appointed. Any members appointed by the Governor to fill a vacancy occurring otherwise than by expiration of a term shall be appointed in the same way and with the same qualifications as set forth in paragraph (1) and shall hold office for the remainder of the unexpired term.
  - (5) Each member of the commission shall be eligible for reappointment, and any member appointed to the commission by the Governor may be removed by the Governor for neglect of duty or malfeasance in office.
- Members appointed to the commission by the Governor shall receive \$100 per day for each day actually engaged in the business of the commission as compensation for serving as members and shall devote such time and effort to the prosecution of the commission's business as is necessary to fulfill the commission's obligations under law. Such members shall also be entitled to reimbursement in accordance with Commonwealth regulations for reasonable traveling, lodging and other necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.
- 30 (7) All members shall be employed or engaged in business

- in this Commonwealth or, if retired, shall be residents of
- 2 this Commonwealth.
- 3 (8) A majority of the members of the commission shall
- 4 constitute a quorum. All decisions shall require the
- 5 concurrence of a majority of the members of the commission.
- 6 The commission shall keep a full and accurate record of all
- 7 proceedings and of all resolutions, regulations and orders
- 8 issued or adopted.
- 9 (c) Executive secretary. -- The commission shall employ an
- 10 <u>executive secretary</u>, independent of the department, who shall be
- 11 responsible for the daily operation and administrative functions
- 12 of the commission.
- 13 Section 5. Powers and duties of commission.
- 14 The commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 15 (1) To adopt, issue, amend and rescind suitable rules
- and regulations to carry out the provisions and purposes of
- 17 this act.
- 18 (2) To hear and determine all grants allowable under
- 19 this act.
- 20 (3) To receive funds from Federal, State and private
- sources, to deposit the funds in an interest-bearing
- 22 restricted revenue account pursuant to section 4 and to
- authorize expenditures from this fund for the purposes of
- carrying out the provisions of this act.
- 25 (4) To coordinate animal health, animal research and
- animal diagnostic programs in this Commonwealth, including,
- 27 but not limited to, those programs conducted at The
- 28 Pennsylvania State University, the [Department of
- 29 Agriculture] <u>department</u> and the University of Pennsylvania:
- 30 Provided, That this coordination shall not affect the

1 [Department of Agriculture] department in discharging its 2 statutory and regulatory authority concerning the prevention, 3 control or eradication of dangerous transmissible diseases of animals or birds. 4 5 (5) To make grants for, and acquire data regarding, animal health research, including, but not limited to: 6 (i) the determination of long-term animal health 7 trends within the animal health industry, with emphasis 8 upon those areas deemed most critical to the animal 9 10 agriculture producers, the nutrition and health of the 11 consumers and the quality of life in rural communities; (ii) the prioritization of animal health research 12 13 projects; (iii) the maximization of receipt of grant funds 14 from Federal agencies for animal health research; 15 (iv) the maximization of receipt of funds from 16 17 private sources interested in animal health research; 18 (v) the distribution of funds for animal health 19 research projects to those institutions or agencies 20 within the Commonwealth which conduct contracted diagnostic work in animal health; 21 (vi) the evaluation of factors involved in animal 22 23 health problems to determine which are biologic in origin 24 and which are caused by improper livestock management; 25 (vii) the computerized compilation, maintenance, indexing and dissemination of animal health research 26 27 projects and results, where available, especially in 28 those cases where research was funded wholly or partially by the Commonwealth; 29

(viii) the determination of the need for capital

1 funding for research facilities and equipment; (ix) the conduct of annual surveys of the veterinary 2 medical profession, the food processing industries and 3 businesses related to livestock agriculture to isolate 4 trends or circumstances which may threaten animal or 5 human health; and 6 the exchange of biomedical research and 7 information between human health and animal health 8 sources, including the isolation of animal disease 9 10 models. To make grants for, and acquire data regarding, 11 animal disease diagnosis, including, but not limited to: 12 13 (i) the development of a coordinated reporting and monitoring system for animal disease diagnosis; 14 15 (ii) the development of toxicological capabilities, 16 especially those related to a drug detection program for 17 horse racing and to a determination of animal health 18 problems because of the close proximity of animal 19 agriculture to mining and to oil and gas drilling; 20 (iii) the expansion of diagnostic virology 21 capabilities, especially those related to virus isolation 22 procedures; and 23 (iv) the determination of the need for capital funding for animal disease diagnostic facilities and 24 25 equipment. 26 (7) To make recommendations to the General Assembly and 27 to the [Department of Agriculture] department regarding 28 animal health research, animal disease diagnosis and indemnification for losses caused by animal disease. 29 (8) To advise the Governor, the department and the 30

- 2 and efficacy of animal health policies and programs within
- 3 this Commonwealth.
- 4 (9) To make an annual report to the General Assembly on
- 5 the administration of this act.
- 6 (10) To make, by February 1, an annual budget request to
- 7 the Governor and to the General Assembly.
- 8 Section 6. Assistance by [Department of Agriculture]
- 9 <u>department</u>.
- 10 The [Department of Agriculture] <u>department</u> shall assist the
- 11 commission by providing office space and such personnel and
- 12 other administrative support as needed for the execution of the
- 13 commission's function under this act.
- 14 Section 4. This act shall apply as follows:
- 15 (1) The addition of section 3(b)(1)(vi) of the act shall
- apply to the first vacancy reappointment submitted by the
- 17 Governor under section 3(b)(1)(v) of the act which occurs
- 18 after the effective date of this act.
- 19 (2) The addition of section 3(b)(1)(vii) of the act
- 20 shall apply to the second vacancy reappointment submitted by
- 21 the Governor under section 3(b)(1)(v) of the act which occurs
- after the effective date of this act.
- 23 (3) For purposes of this section, it is not significant
- 24 whether the reappointment is made because of expiration of
- 25 term or otherwise.
- 26 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
