AN ACT

1 Amending Titles 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) and 71
2 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes,
3 ~~further providing for seats of courts and for local chamber~~ ←
4 ~~facilities;~~ providing for county-level court administrators
5 and for the transfer of accumulated annual leave and sick
6 leave of certain county administrators transferred to the
7 State judicial personnel system; establishing the Unified
8 Judicial System Transferred County-Level Administrator Leave
9 Fund; requiring certain county payments; requiring periodic
10 reports; providing for the transfer of county-level court
11 administrators to the State Employees' Retirement System; and
12 making a repeal.

13 Pursuant to the Judiciary Article of the Constitution of
14 Pennsylvania and its establishment of the Unified Judicial
15 System and consistent with the authority of the General Assembly
16 regarding expenditure of Commonwealth funds pursuant to Article
17 III, Section 24, and while otherwise expressly reserving its
18 appropriation and other legislative authority as to the funding
19 of the Unified Judicial System, it is the intent of the General
20 Assembly to facilitate the administration of the Unified
21 Judicial System by providing for inclusion of key designated
22 county-level court administrators and their designated deputies,

1 associates and assistant administrators and special courts
2 administrators within the State judicial personnel system and
3 for their compensation by the Commonwealth.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5 hereby enacts as follows:

16 SECTION 1. TITLE 42 OF PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES IS ←
17 AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ:

18 § 1905. County-level court administrators.

19 (a) Transition.--Effective on a date established by the
20 Supreme Court, the offices of district court administrators,
21 deputy court administrators, special courts administrators,
22 associate and assistant court administrators and similar
23 positions as currently designated by the Administrative Office
24 of Pennsylvania Courts upon the advice of the respective
25 president judges of the courts of common pleas shall be included
26 within the State judicial personnel system and the individuals
27 holding such offices shall be compensated by the Commonwealth
28 through the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts from
29 funds appropriated for such purpose. On the established date,
30 individuals holding such offices shall become State employees;

1 and their status as employees of the respective counties shall
2 cease.

3 (b) Compensation.--The Administrative Office of Pennsylvania
4 Courts shall establish salaries and other compensation for those
5 individuals entering the State judicial personnel system
6 pursuant to subsection (a).

7 (c) Compensation plan.--The Administrative Office of
8 Pennsylvania Courts, with the approval of the Supreme Court,
9 shall, consistent with section 1724 (relating to personnel of
10 the system), establish a plan for use on an ongoing basis for
11 compensation of those individuals entering the State judicial
12 personnel system pursuant to subsection (a) and their
13 successors.

14 (d) Vacancies.--

15 (1) If a vacancy occurs in an office included in the
16 State judicial personnel system pursuant to subsection (a),
17 the vacancy shall be filled by the president judge or, in
18 districts where there are administrative judges, by the
19 president judge after consultation with the administrative
20 judges.

21 (2) The Court Administrator of Pennsylvania, with the
22 approval of the Supreme Court, shall establish standards and
23 qualifications for individuals appointed to fill vacancies
24 under paragraph (1).

25 (e) Reports to appropriations committees.--Consistent with
26 the requirements of section 3531 (relating to budget
27 implementation data), the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania
28 shall make monthly reports to the Chairman and Minority Chairman
29 of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the Chairman
30 and Minority Chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the

1 House of Representatives of expenditures for compensation and
2 related expenditures for individuals who are compensated by the
3 Commonwealth pursuant to this section.

21 § 2391. Short title of subchapter.

22 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the
23 Unified Judicial System Transferred County-Level Administrator
24 Leave Benefit Act.

25 § 2392. Definitions.

26 The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
27 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
28 context clearly indicates otherwise:

29 "Date of transfer." The date established pursuant to section
30 1905 (relating to county-level court administrators) for

1 transfer of designated administrators from employment by their
2 employing county to employment by the State government of the
3 Commonwealth through the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania
4 Courts.

5 "Employing county." The county by which a designated
6 administrator is employed on the day immediately preceding the
7 designated administrator's date of transfer.

8 "Fund." The Unified Judicial System Transferred County-Level
9 Administrator Leave Fund established under section 2397
10 (relating to county payments for certain leave).

11 "State judicial personnel policies." Those personnel
12 policies and procedures established and amended by or through a
13 process created by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court and applicable
14 to personnel of the unified judicial system.

15 "Transferred administrator." Personnel designated under
16 section 1905 (relating to county-level court administrators).

17 "Unified judicial system." The various courts and offices
18 enumerated in Article V of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
19 § 2393. Holidays.

20 On and after the date of transfer to the State judicial
21 personnel system, transferred administrators shall be eligible
22 for those paid holidays specified in State judicial personnel
23 policies.

24 § 2394. Sick leave and annual leave.

25 (a) Accrued sick leave and annual leave to be transferred.--
26 Subject to the provisions of subsection (b), sick leave and
27 annual leave accrued by a transferred administrator prior to the
28 date of transfer shall be transferred based upon the accrued
29 sick leave and annual leave balances credited to the transferred
30 administrator by the employing county as of the day immediately

1 preceding the transferred administrator's date of transfer.

2 (b) Accrued sick leave and annual leave to be credited.--
3 Credit for the sick leave and annual leave transferred under
4 subsection (a) shall not exceed the maximum amount permitted for
5 sick leave and annual leave carryover leave allowances from
6 calendar year to calendar year by State judicial personnel
7 policies in effect on the date of transfer. Accrued sick leave
8 or annual leave transferred under this section shall be used by
9 the transferred administrator only as a credit toward sick leave
10 or annual leave, as the case may be, to be taken in the future.
11 The sick leave or annual leave credited under this subsection
12 shall not, at the time of transfer, be reimbursed to the
13 transferred administrator in the form of a lump-sum payout or
14 other leave payout or in any other form which may be permitted
15 by the personnel policies of the employing county in effect on
16 the day immediately preceding the date of transfer. In the event
17 a transferred administrator has accrued leave that is eligible
18 for transfer and that under the employing county's personnel
19 policies in effect on the day immediately preceding the date of
20 transfer could be used by the transferred administrator as
21 either sick leave or annual leave, such leave shall be credited
22 to the transferred administrator with one-half of the leave
23 designated as sick leave and one-half of the leave designated as
24 annual leave.

25 (c) Excess leave.--Credit for accrued sick leave or annual
26 leave which exceeds the maximum allowed by subsection (b) shall
27 be subject to leave policies in effect in the employing county
28 on the day immediately preceding the date of transfer. Any lump-
29 sum payments or other sick leave payments or annual leave
30 payments made pursuant to this subsection are and shall remain

1 the financial responsibility of the employing county.

2 § 2395. Other leave.

3 With the exception of leave specified in section 2394
4 (relating to sick leave and annual leave), a transferred
5 administrator may receive a lump-sum payment or other payment
6 for other accrued leave as permitted by the personnel policies
7 of the employing county in effect on the day immediately
8 preceding the date of transfer. Any lump-sum payment or other
9 leave payments made pursuant to this section are and shall
10 remain the financial responsibility of the employing county. For
11 purposes of this section, the term "other accrued leave" shall
12 not include accrued sick leave and accrued annual leave, and
13 shall include accrued disability leave, accrued personal leave,
14 accrued compensatory leave and other types of accrued leave
15 encompassed within the employing county's personnel policies on
16 the day immediately preceding the date of transfer.

17 § 2396. Leave following transfer.

18 (a) Leave accrual following date of transfer.--On and after
19 the date of transfer, leave shall be accrued by transferred
20 administrators as provided by State judicial personnel policies.
21 For purposes of determining the accrual rate for annual leave,
22 the term "service" shall mean State and county service which is
23 creditable for retirement purposes, excluding any nonstate or
24 noncounty service which may be creditable for State or county
25 retirement purposes.

26 (b) Leave carryover following date of transfer.--On and
27 after the date of transfer, a transferred administrator shall be
28 permitted to carry accrued leave from calendar year to calendar
29 year as provided by State judicial personnel policies.

30 (c) Leave eligible for payment.--If a transferred

1 administrator terminates active service with the unified
2 judicial system, such transferred administrator shall be paid
3 for sick leave and annual leave transferred and credited under
4 section 2394 (relating to sick leave and annual leave) and for
5 sick, annual and other leave accrued on and after the date of
6 transfer as permitted by State judicial personnel policies in
7 effect on the transferred administrator's date of termination.
8 § 2397. County payments for certain leave.

9 (a) County payments.--Each employing county shall provide
10 payment to the Commonwealth for the accrued sick leave and
11 annual leave transferred and credited pursuant to section 2394
12 (relating to sick leave and annual leave). Within 30 days of the
13 date specified in section 1905(a) (relating to county-level
14 court administrators), each employing county shall provide, in
15 writing, to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts,
16 all leave information requested by the Court Administrator of
17 Pennsylvania for those individuals designated in section
18 1905(a). The payment to be made by each employing county shall
19 be determined based upon an actuarial evaluation performed by an
20 actuary appointed by the Court Administrator of Pennsylvania
21 from a list of three actuaries to be submitted by the Secretary
22 of the Budget within 30 days of the effective date of this
23 subchapter. The actuarial evaluation shall be based upon
24 assumptions determined by the actuary to be appropriate under
25 the circumstances to arrive at a fair and reasonable
26 determination of an actuarially equivalent value of the accrued
27 sick leave and annual leave transferred and credited under
28 section 2394. The actuary shall submit the actuarial evaluation
29 to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts within 60
30 days of the receipt of all information necessary to prepare such

1 evaluation. If any employing county fails to provide the
2 information required by this section, the county shall be
3 subject to a penalty of \$100 per day for each transferred
4 employee until the required information is provided. Such
5 penalties shall be paid into the fund.

6 (b) Notice of payment due and payment method.--Following
7 receipt of the actuarial evaluation required by subsection (a),
8 the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts shall notify in
9 writing each employing county of the actuarial value
10 attributable to that county for accrued sick leave and annual
11 leave transferred and credited under section 2394. Each
12 employing county shall be obligated to the Commonwealth for
13 payment of the actuarial value of the accrued sick leave and
14 annual leave transferred and credited under section 2394.
15 Payment shall be made to the Commonwealth by each employing
16 county within 90 days of the date of the written notice from the
17 Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts to the employing
18 county, which date is referred to for purposes of this section
19 as the payment due date. Any payment not received from an
20 employing county by the payment due date shall be subject to the
21 imposition of interest from the day following the payment due
22 date at the rate determined by the Secretary of Revenue for
23 interest payments on overdue taxes or the refund of taxes as
24 provided in section 806 and 806.1 of the act of April 9, 1929
25 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, and any subsequent
26 amendments to those sections, plus 2% until paid in full.

27 (c) Recoupment of employing county arrearages.--If an
28 employing county fails to submit a payment by the payment due
29 date established under subsection (b), the Administrative Office
30 of Pennsylvania Courts shall withhold and withdraw such payment,

1 plus applicable interest, if any, from moneys next due to be
2 paid to the employing county in the form of grants, subsidies or
3 other payments to counties which are made by the Administrative
4 Office of Pennsylvania Courts. Any moneys withheld or withdrawn
5 under this subsection or received under subsection (b) shall be
6 transferred to and deposited in the fund created under
7 subsection (d) and credited to the employing county's financial
8 obligation under this subchapter.

9 (d) Establishment of fund.--There is hereby created a
10 special nonlapsing fund in the State Treasury to be known as the
11 Unified Judicial System Transferred County-Level Administrator
12 Leave Fund. All moneys received from employing counties under
13 this section and all investment income earned on those moneys
14 shall be deposited in the fund. All moneys placed in the fund
15 and the investment income it accrues are hereby appropriated on
16 a continuing basis to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania
17 Courts, upon requisition by the Court Administrator of
18 Pennsylvania, to be applied solely to the cost of leave payments
19 made under section 2396(c) (relating to leave following
20 transfer). The requisition authority granted with regard to the
21 fund is in addition to the requisition authority contained in
22 section 1501 of The Fiscal Code.

23 (e) Fund deficiency.--If money in the fund is not adequate
24 to provide for full payment of the counties' share of leave
25 payments, the amount necessary to fully fund the counties' share
26 of leave payments shall become an obligation of the unified
27 judicial system.

28 (f) Fund surplus.--When all leave payments for transferred
29 administrators required to be made under this subchapter have
30 been made, any surplus remaining in the fund shall be

1 transferred to and is hereby appropriated to the General Fund.

17 "County service." Service credited in a retirement system or
 18 pension plan established or maintained by a county to provide
 19 retirement benefits for its employees to the account of county
 20 employees who are transferred to State employment and become
 21 State employees pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 1905 (relating to
 22 county-level court administrators) regardless of whether the
 23 service was performed for the county, another employer or
 24 allowed to be purchased in the county retirement system or
 25 pension plan.

26 "Creditable nonstate service." Service other than service as
 27 a State employee or service converted to State service pursuant
 28 to section 5303.1 (relating to election to convert county
 29 service to State service) for which an active member may obtain
 30 credit.

2 "State service." Service converted from county service
3 pursuant to section 5303.1 (relating to election to convert
4 county service to State service) or rendered as a State
5 employee.

6 * * *

7 "Superannuation age." Any age upon accrual of 35 eligibility
8 points or age 60, except for a member of the General Assembly,
9 an enforcement officer, a correction officer, a psychiatric
10 security aide, a Delaware River Port Authority policeman or an
11 officer of the Pennsylvania State Police, age 50, and except for
12 a member with Class G, Class H, Class I, Class J, Class K, Class
13 L, Class M or Class N service, age 55 upon accrual of 20
14 eligibility points.

16 "Vestee." A member with ten or more eligibility points, or a
17 member with Class G, Class H, Class I, Class J, Class K, Class
18 L, Class M or Class N service with eight or more eligibility
19 points, who has terminated State service and has elected to
20 leave his total accumulated deductions in the fund and to defer
21 receipt of an annuity.

22 Section 4. Sections 5301 and 5302 of Title 71 are amended by
23 adding subsections to read:

24 § 5301. Mandatory and optional membership.

25 * * *

26 (e) Election prohibited.--Notwithstanding subsections
27 (a)(13) and (c), county employees who are transferred to State
28 employment and become State employees pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. §
29 1905 (relating to county-level court administrators) shall not
30 have the election to remain a contributor in the retirement

1 system or pension plan of the county by which they were employed
2 prior to becoming eligible for membership in the State
3 Employees' Retirement System. Such employees shall be mandatory
4 members of the system provided they are otherwise eligible and
5 unless they are eligible for optional membership pursuant to
6 subsections (a)(1) through (11) and (b) or prohibited membership
7 pursuant to subsections (a)(14) and (c).

8 § 5302. Credited State service.

9 * * *

10 (d.1) Effect of converting county service to State
11 service.--A county employee transferred to State employment
12 pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 1905 (relating to county-level court
13 administrators) who elects to convert county service to State
14 service pursuant to section 5303.1 (relating to election to
15 convert county service to State service) shall receive one year
16 or fractional part of a year of State service credit for each
17 year or fractional part of a year, as the case may be, of county
18 service credited in the county retirement system or pension
19 plan; provided, however, that no more than one year of State
20 service of all classes will be credited in any one calendar year
21 and that no State service credit shall be received for county
22 service that is already credited in the system or in the Public
23 School Employees' Retirement System.

29 (b) Eligibility points for prospective credited service.--

30 * * *

1 (1.1) Every active member of the system who elects to
2 convert county service to State service pursuant to section
3 5303.1 (relating to election to convert county service to
4 State service) shall receive eligibility points in accordance
5 with section 5307 for converted county service upon
6 compliance with section 5303.1(b). The class or classes of
7 service in which the member may be credited for converted
8 county service shall be determined in accordance with section
9 5306(c).

11 Section 6. Title 71 is amended by adding a section to read:

12 § 5303.1. Election to convert county service to State service.

13 (a) General rule.--County employees who are transferred to
14 State employment pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 1905 (relating to
15 county-level court administrators) may elect to convert their
16 county service in the retirement system or pension plan in which
17 they were contributors immediately prior to the transfer to
18 State employment.

19 (b) Time for making election.--The election to convert
20 county service to State service must be made by filing written
21 notice with the board within 90 days after the transfer to State
22 employment. An election to convert service shall be effective
23 when filed with the board, but shall not be effective before the
24 date of transfer to State employment. An election to convert
25 county service to State service shall be irrevocable.

26 (c) Effect of failure to make election.--Failure to elect to
27 convert county service to State service within the election
28 period set forth in subsection (b) shall result in the county
29 service not being converted to State service. Transferred
30 employees who do not elect to convert county service to State

1 service shall not have the opportunity to make a subsequent
2 conversion election should they later obtain different
3 employment in the unified judicial system or other State
4 employment eligible for membership in the system.

5 (d) Effect of election.--An election to convert county
6 service to State service shall convert all county service in the
7 retirement system or pension plan in which the transferred
8 employee was a member immediately before the transfer to State
9 employment, even if not performed as a judicial system employee
10 of the county. The election shall not convert service in other
11 retirement systems or pension plans that is not credited in the
12 county plan from which the member is transferred. Once the
13 conversion occurs, the converted service shall lose all
14 attributes and characteristics as county service and shall be
15 State service as set forth in this part.

19 (b) Limitations on eligibility.--An active member or a
20 multiple service member who is a school employee and an active
21 member of the Public School Employees' Retirement System shall
22 be eligible to receive credit for nonstate service provided that
23 he does not have credit for such service in the system or in the
24 school system and is not entitled to receive, eligible to
25 receive now or in the future, or is receiving retirement

28 relations order is not certified as an approved domestic

26 recent receipt of an annuity that is not returned to the State

30 Section 20. Except as otherwise set forth in this act,

1 county employees who are transferred to State employment
2 pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. § 1905 shall be subject to the terms and

2 terminated effective the day before the transfer. No further

28 service, the transferred employee may make application to the
29 county pension plan or retirement system as if the transferred

1 whatever rights and benefits, including an immediate lump sum
2 distribution or an annuity from the county pension plan or
3 retirement system equal to the contributions and interest in the
4 member's account with the county, provided to a terminating
5 member with the age and service the member would have possessed
6 had the member remained a full-time employee of the county. Such
7 election must be in writing filed with the administrator of the
8 county pension plan or retirement system from which the county
9 service is being converted and must be made within 30 days after
10 the election to convert county service to State service.

12 Section 27. Notwithstanding any regulation promulgated by
