AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of July 10, 1990 (P.L.404, No.98), entitled "An
- 2 act providing for the certification of real estate
- appraisers; specifying requirements for certification;
- 4 providing for sanctions and penalties; and making an
- 5 appropriation, providing for continuing education for
- 6 broker/appraisers; and making an editorial change.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 10 of the act of July 10, 1990 (P.L.404,
- 10 No.98), known as the Real Estate Appraisers Certification Act,
- 11 is amended to read:
- 12 Section 10. Certification renewal; records.
- 13 (a) Renewal term.--Renewal of certification shall be on a
- 14 biennial basis.
- 15 (b) Continuing education for residential and general
- 16 appraisers. -- The board shall by regulation require evidence of
- 17 professional activity or continuing education as a condition of
- 18 certification renewal of residential and general appraisers if,
- 19 and only to the minimum extent, required pursuant to the

- 1 Financial Institutions Reform, Recovery, and Enforcement Act of
- 2 1989 (Public Law 101-73, 103 Stat. 183). No credit shall be
- 3 given for any course in office management or practice building.
- 4 [In order to facilitate the speedy implementation of this act,
- 5 the board shall have the power and authority to promulgate,
- 6 adopt and use guidelines to prescribe the evidence of
- 7 professional activity or continuing certification required for
- 8 certification renewal pursuant to this section. Such guidelines
- 9 shall be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The guidelines
- 10 shall not be subject to review pursuant to section 205 of the
- 11 act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
- 12 Commonwealth Documents Law, sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the
- 13 act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the
- 14 Commonwealth Attorneys Act, or the act of June 25, 1982
- 15 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, and shall
- 16 be effective for a period not to exceed two years from the
- 17 effective date of this act. After the expiration of the two-year
- 18 period, the guidelines shall expire and shall be replaced by
- 19 regulations which shall have been promulgated, adopted and
- 20 published as provided by law.]
- 21 (b.1) Continuing education for broker/appraisers.--
- 22 Broker/appraisers shall be subject to the same continuing
- 23 <u>education requirements for certification renewal as residential</u>
- 24 and general appraisers. The board shall have the power and
- 25 <u>authority to promulgate</u>, <u>adopt and use guidelines</u> REGULATIONS to
- 26 <u>prescribe evidence of continuing education required for</u>
- 27 certification renewal pursuant to this section. Such quidelines <-
- 28 shall be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. The quidelines
- 29 <u>shall not be subject to review pursuant to section 205 of the</u>
- 30 act of July 31, 1968 (P.L. 769, No. 240), referred to as the

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- 2 <u>act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the</u>
- 3 <u>Commonwealth Attorneys Act, or the act of June 25, 1982</u>
- 4 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act, and shall
- 5 be effective for a period not to exceed June 30, 2001. After
- 6 June 30, 2001, the guidelines shall expire and be replaced by
- 7 regulations which shall have been promulgated, adopted and
- 8 published as provided by law.
- 9 (c) Records.--A record of all persons certified as real
- 10 estate appraisers in this Commonwealth shall be kept in the
- 11 office of the board and shall be open to public inspection and
- 12 copying upon payment of a nominal fee for copying the record.
- 13 Each certificateholder shall advise the board of the address of
- 14 his or her principal place of business.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
