AN ACT

Redesignating a portion of the Lackawanna Valley Industrial
 Highway, SR 0006, as the Governor Robert P. Casey Highway;
 and designating the Olyphant on and off ramp, Exit 2 of the
 Lackawanna Valley Industrial Highway as the Representative
 Joseph G. Wargo Exit; AND DESIGNATING A SECTION OF U.S. ROUTE
 11 IN COLUMBIA COUNTY AS COLUMBIA BOULEVARD.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. The section of the Lackawanna Valley Industrial Highway, SR 0006, beginning at Interstate 81 in the Borough of 10 Dunmore in Lackawanna County and ending in the Village of 11 12 White's Crossing in Wayne County, Pennsylvania, is redesignated as the Governor Robert P. Casey Highway. 13 14 Section 2. The on and off ramp in Olyphant designated as 15 Exit 2 of the Lackawanna Valley Industrial Highway is 16 redesignated as the Representative Joseph G. Wargo Exit. 17 SECTION 3. THE SECTION OF U.S. ROUTE 11 FROM THE

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INTERSECTION WITH EAST STREET (SR 487) AND WEST SIXTH STREET IN
 THE TOWN OF BLOOMSBURG TO THE BRIDGE OVER BRIAR CREEK IN THE
 BOROUGH OF BRIAR CREEK, COLUMBIA COUNTY, IS HEREBY DESIGNATED
 AND SHALL BE KNOWN AS COLUMBIA BOULEVARD.

5 Section 3. 4. (A) The Department of Transportation shall <--
6 erect and maintain appropriate signs displaying the names of the
7 highway and the exit.

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8 (B) THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND 9 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS IDENTIFYING THE BEGINNING AND END OF 10 THE SECTION OF U. S. ROUTE 11 DESIGNATED UNDER SECTION 3 AS 11 COLUMBIA BOULEVARD.

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 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
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 SECTION 5. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT AS FOLLOWS:

 SECTIONS 3 AND 4(B) SHALL TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 1,

14 (1) SECTIONS 3 AND 4(B) SHALL TAKE EFFECT JANUARY 1, 15 2000.

16 (2) THIS SECTION SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.

17 (3) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 6018 DAYS.

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
