AN ACT

1 Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled, as
2 reenacted, "An act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and
3 malt and brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating
4 and changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5 restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6 consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7 in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8 liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9 persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10 duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11 for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12 for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13 municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14 nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15 without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16 providing for local option, and repealing existing laws,"
17 further providing for breweries and for limited wineries.

18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
19 hereby enacts as follows:

20 Section 1. Section 446(2) of the act of April 12, 1951
21 (P.L.90, No.21), known as the Liquor Code, reenacted and amended
22 June 29, 1987 (P.L.32, No.14) and amended February 18, 1998
23 (P.L.162, No.25), is amended to read:

24 Section 446. Breweries.--Holders of a brewery license may:

25 * * *

1 (2) Operate a restaurant or brewery pub on the licensed
2 premises under such conditions and regulations as the board may
3 enforce: Provided, however, That sales on Sunday may be made
4 irrespective of the volume of food sales if the licensed
5 premises are at a stadium or arena location. The holder of a
6 brewery license may sell at its brewery pub premises
7 Pennsylvania wines it has purchased from either the holder of a
8 Pennsylvania limited winery license or from the board: Provided,
9 however, That said wines must be consumed at the licensed
10 brewery pub premises.

12 Section 2. Section 505.2(3) of the act, amended June 18,
13 1998 (P.L.664, No.86), is amended to read:

14 Section 505.2. Limited Wineries.--In the interest of
15 promoting tourism and recreational development in Pennsylvania,
16 holders of a limited winery license may:

17 * * *

18 (3) Separately or in conjunction with other limited
19 wineries, sell alcoholic cider, wine and wine coolers produced
20 by the limited winery on no more than five (5) board-approved
21 locations other than the licensed premises, with no bottling or
22 production requirement at those additional board-approved
23 locations and under such conditions and regulations as the board
24 may enforce, to the board, to individuals and to brewery, hotel,
25 restaurant, club and public service liquor licensees.

27 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
