AN ACT

1 2	Amending the act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), entitled "An act providing for the administration of a statewide system of
3	vital statistics; prescribing the functions of the State
4	Department of Health, the State Advisory Health Board and
5	local registrars; imposing duties upon coroners,
б	prothonotaries, clerks of orphans' court, physicians,
7	midwives and other persons; requiring reports and
8	certificates for the registration of vital statistics;
9	regulating the disposition of dead bodies; limiting the
10	disclosure of records; prescribing the sufficiency of vital
11	statistics records as evidence; prescribing fees and
12	penalties; and revising and consolidating the laws relating
13	thereto," providing for Department of Health transfer of
14	funds; and further providing for local registrars' fees and
15	for issuance of certificates of death.
16	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17	hereby enacts as follows:
18	Section 1. The act of June 29, 1953 (P.L.304, No.66), known
19	as the Vital Statistics Law of 1953, is amended by adding a
20	section to read:
21	<u>Section 206. Department: Transfer of Funds(a) The</u>
22	department shall annually distribute the accrued funds received
23	pursuant to sections 304(b) and 804.1(b) to the county coroner

1	or medical examiner in the same county or region as represented
2	by the local registrar or local department office. The COUNTY
3	WHERE THE DEATH OCCURRED. THE department shall promulgate
4	regulations regarding the collection, retention and distribution
5	of the fees received under sections 304(b) and 804.1(b).
6	(b) The department shall require any funds received by
7	county coroners or medical examiners under this section to be
8	used for the purposes of laboratory or necropsy room
9	modernization, including supplies, equipment, training and
10	office and laboratory facility improvement or the modernization
11	of equipment used for forensic investigation. The department may
12	promulgate regulations to implement this section including an
13	annual audit regarding the use of these funds, in addition to
14	any other annual audit performed at the county level.
15	Section 2. Section 304 of the act, amended December 20, 1991
16	(P.L.399, No.46), is amended to read:
17	Section 304. Registration Districts: Local Registrars'
18	Compensation(a) Each local registrar shall be paid a fee of
19	one dollar (\$1) for each certificate transmitted in accordance
20	with the provisions of this act or for each report of no
21	certificates filed during any calendar month. The fees
22	prescribed by this section shall be paid by the Commonwealth
23	from funds appropriated to the department.
24	(b) Local registrars shall issue certificates of death from
25	original certificates of death in their possession upon
26	completion of a period of instruction on the preparation of
27	certificates by representatives of the Division of Vital
28	Records. For each certificate issued, the local registrar shall
29	receive a fee of [two dollars (\$2).] <u>five dollars (\$5) from the</u>
30	requester. Each fee received by a local registrar shall be
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1	distributed as follows: four dollars (\$4) shall be retained by
2	the local registrar, except as provided for in subsection (c),
3	and one dollar (\$1) shall be transmitted to the department for
4	distribution to the county coroner or medical examiner as
5	provided for in section 206.
б	(c) A local registrar may not receive an aggregate amount of
7	fees in excess of [thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000)] <u>forty</u>
8	<u>thousand dollars (\$40,000)</u> in any one calendar year. <u>Upon</u>
9	receiving an aggregate of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) in
10	fees in one calendar year, the local registrar shall transmit
11	the fee it is authorized to retain under subsection (b) to the
12	department.
13	(d) Any regulation inconsistent with or contrary to the
14	provisions of this section is superseded.
15	Section 3. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
16	Section 804.1. Records: Certified Copy of Death(a) Upon
17	application therefor and payment of a fee of five dollars (\$5),
18	the department shall issue a certified copy of a certificate of
19	death.
20	(b) When there is no local registrar, upon application
21	thereof and payment of a fee of five dollars (\$5), the local
22	department office shall issue a certificate of death. Each fee
23	received by the local department office shall be distributed as
24	follows: four dollars (\$4) shall be retained by the department
25	and one dollar (\$1) shall be retained by the department for
26	distribution to the county coroner or medical examiner as
27	provided for in section 206.
28	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
