AN ACT

- Making an appropriation from a restricted revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.
 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following sums, or as much thereof as may be
- 7 necessary, are specifically appropriated from the restricted
- 8 revenue account within the General Fund and from Federal
- 9 augmentation funds to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission
- 10 to provide for the operation of the commission for the fiscal
- 11 year July 1, 2000, to June 30, 2001, for the purposes and in the
- 12 amounts shown:
- 13 Federal State
- 14 For the salaries, wages and all
- 15 necessary expenses for the proper
- 16 operation and administration of the
- 17 Pennsylvania Public Utility

- 1 Commission, including the chairman and
- 2 commissioners and the Bureau of Safety
- 3 and Enforcement.
