1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, NO.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," providing for administrative definitions, for visitation and for entry and inspection of child day-care centers.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 901 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31,
9	No.21), known as the Public Welfare Code, is amended by adding
10	definitions to read:
11	Section 901. DefinitionsAs used in this article
12	"Child day care" means care in lieu of parental care given
13	for part of the twenty-four hour day to children under sixteen
14	years of age, away from their own homes, but does not include
15	child day care furnished in places of worship during religious
16	services.
17	"Child day care center" means any premises in which child day

<u>care is provided simultaneously for seven or more children who</u>
 <u>are not relatives of the operator.</u>

4 Section 2. Section 911(a) of the act is amended by adding a 5 clause to read:

6 Section 911. Visitation and Inspection.--(a) The department7 shall have the power, and its duty shall be:

8 (1) To make and enforce rules and regulations for a 9 visitation, examination and inspection of all supervised 10 institutions and said visitation, examination or inspection may 11 occur both before and after the beginning of operation of the 12 supervised facility.

13 (2) To visit and inspect, at least once in each year, all 14 State and supervised institutions; to inquire and examine into 15 their methods of instruction, discipline, detention, care or 16 treatment, the care, treatment, government or management of 17 their inmates or those committed thereto, or being detained, 18 treated or residing therein, the official conduct of their inspectors, trustees, managers, directors or other officer or 19 20 officers charged with their management by law or otherwise, or 21 having the management, care, custody or control thereof, the 22 buildings, grounds, premises, and equipment thereof, or 23 connected therewith, and all and every matter and thing relating to their usefulness, administration, and management, and to the 24 25 welfare of the inmates thereof, or those committed thereto or 26 being detained, treated or residing therein.

27 (3) To inspect child day care centers during operational 28 hours, without prior notice, to determine the standard of care 29 being administered to the children for whom child day care is 30 provided.

2 Section 3. Section 1016 of the act, amended July 15, 1976
3 (P.L.993, No.202), is amended to read:

4 Section 1016. Right to Enter and Inspect. -- For the purpose 5 of determining the suitability of the applicants and of the premises or whether or not any premises in fact qualifies as a 6 facility as defined in section 1001 of this act or the 7 8 continuing conformity of the licensees to this act and to the 9 applicable regulations of the department, any authorized agent 10 of the department shall have the right to enter, visit and 11 inspect any facility licensed or requiring a license under this act and shall have full and free access to the records of the 12 13 facility and to the individuals therein and full opportunity to 14 interview, inspect or examine such individuals. If the facility 15 is a child day care center, the authorized agent shall have the right to enter, visit and inspect the facility during 16

17 operational hours without prior notice.

18 An authorized agent of the department shall also confer with 19 the operators of facilities regarding the minimum standards of 20 the department, encourage the adoption of higher standards and 21 recommend methods of improving care and services.

Section 4. Section 1074 of the act, added December 5, 1980 (P.L.1112, No.193), is amended to read:

24 Section 1074. Visitation and Inspection. -- The department or 25 authorized agent of the department shall have the right to 26 enter, visit and inspect [on a random sample basis, upon 27 complaint, or upon request of the caregiver] during operational 28 hours without prior notice, any family day care home registered or requiring registration under this article and shall have free 29 30 and full access to the premises, where children are cared for, 20010H0516B0554 - 3 -

all records of the premises which relate to the children's care,
 and to the children cared for therein and full opportunity to
 speak with or observe such children to determine the standard of
 <u>child day care being administered</u>.

5 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
