AN ACT

Amending the act of November 10, 1999 (P.L.491, No.45), entitled "An act establishing a uniform construction code; imposing powers and duties on municipalities and the Department of Labor and Industry; providing for enforcement; imposing penalties; and making repeals," further providing for exemptions.

7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

8 hereby enacts as follows:

9 Section 1. Section 901 of the act of November 10, 1999

10 (P.L.491, No.45), known as the Pennsylvania Construction Code

11 Act, is amended to read:

12 Section 901. Exemptions.

<u>(a) Manufactured housing.--</u>This act shall not apply to
manufactured housing which bears a label, as required by and
referred to in the act of November 17, 1982 (P.L.676, No.192),
known as the Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety
Standards Authorization Act, which certifies that it conforms to
Federal construction and safety standards adopted under the

Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (Public Law 93 383, 88 Stat. 633), nor shall it apply to industrialized
 housing, as defined in the act of May 11, 1972 (P.L.286, No.70),
 known as the Industrialized Housing Act.

5 (b) Religious beliefs.--

(1) An applicant for a construction permit for a 6 7 dwelling unit, school, church or place of assembly by a recognized religious sect may file an application with the 8 9 code administrator to be exempted from any provision of the 10 Uniform Construction Code which conflicts with his religious beliefs. The application shall state the manner in which the 11 12 provision of the Uniform Construction Code conflicts with his 13 religious beliefs and shall include an affidavit by the applicant stating that he is a member of a recognized 14 15 religious sect or division thereof and that he adheres to the 16 established tenets or teachings of the sects or divisions. (2) The code administrator shall grant the application 17 18 for exemption if the applicant is a member of a recognized religious sect or division thereof, which has established 19 20 tenets or teachings conflicting with the provisions of this 21 act. Section 2. This act shall take effect 90 days following 22 23 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of the final adoption of regulations required by the act of November 10, 1999 24
