- 4 telephone, pager or personal digital assistant or any part of
- 5 that technology.
- 6 "Joint committee." The Joint Committee on Information
- 7 Technology and Electronic Commerce established in section 7.
- 8 Section 2. Establishment of council.
- 9 The Information Technology and Electronic Commerce Advisory
- 10 Council is established to advise the General Assembly on
- 11 information technology and electronic commerce policy questions,
- 12 to provide a general forum for discussion of legislative issues
- 13 related to information technology and electronic commerce and to
- 14 focus and report on technology developments and initiatives. The
- 15 council shall be comprised of major leaders of business and
- 16 labor, representatives from the executive and judicial branches
- 17 of government and appointees from legislative staffs and
- 18 agencies, State row offices, major regulatory agencies and
- 19 academe.
- 20 Section 3. Composition of council.
- 21 The council shall consist of the following members:
- 22 (1) To represent the executive branch:
- 23 (i) A representative of the Office for Information
- 24 Technology within the Office of Administration appointed
- 25 by the Governor.
- 26 (ii) A representative of the Auditor General
- 27 appointed by the Auditor General.
- 28 (iii) A representative of the State Treasurer
- 29 appointed by the State Treasurer.
- 30 (iv) A representative of the Attorney General

2	(v) A Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission
3	representative appointed by the chair of the Pennsylvania
4	Public Utility Commission.
5	(2) To represent the judicial branch, a representative
6	of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court appointed by the court.
7	(3) To represent the legislative branch:
8	(i) The Chief Clerk of the Senate.
9	(ii) The Chief Clerk of the House of

L1	(iii) The chair of the Legislative Data Processing

- 2 Section 4. Objectives of council.
- 3 The objectives of the Information Technology and Electronic
- 4 Commerce Advisory Council are:
- 5 (1) To bring a diversity of public and private sector
- 6 perspectives to bear on information technology and electronic
- 7 commerce issues before the Commonwealth.
- 8 (2) To promote proactive discussion of emergent issues
- 9 in information technology and electronic commerce as they may
- 10 affect both the Commonwealth and the operations of the
- 11 General Assembly.
- 12 (3) To identify, examine and assess alternative
- 13 approaches to dealing with the issues identified, together
- 14 with analysis of the pros and cons of each.
- 15 (4) To provide testimony, written analysis, counsel and
- 16 advice to the members and staff of the Communications and
- 17 High Technology Committee of the Senate and the Information
- 18 Technology Subcommittee of the Intergovernmental Relations
- 19 Committee of the House of Representatives and to organize
- 20 briefings, workshops and conferences upon request by the
- 21 Joint Committee on Information Technology and Electronic
- 22 Commerce.
- 23 Section 5. Terms of council members.
- 24 Each council member shall serve for the duration of a two-
- 25 year legislative session or until replaced.
- 26 Section 6. Leadership of council.
- 27 The following rules shall apply:
- 28 (1) The chair and vice chair of the council shall
- 29 alternate between the appointees of the President pro tempore
- 30 of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of

- 2 (2) The appointee of the President pro tempore of the
 3 Senate shall be chair immediately upon the effective date of
 4 this act, and the appointee of the Speaker of the House of
 5 Representatives shall be vice chair.
 - (3) Unless the effective date of this act is the beginning date of a two year session of the General Assembly, the appointee of the President pro tempore of the Senate shall continue to serve as chair and the appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives as vice chair through the next complete two year session of the General Assembly.
 - (4) The chair and vice chair shall alternate in subsequent sessions of the General Assembly between the appointee of the President pro tempore of the Senate and the appointee of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 16 Section 7. Joint Committee on Information Technology and
- 17 <u>Electronic Commerce.</u>
- 18 (a) Purpose and composition of committee.
- (1) The council shall be administered by a Joint

 Committee on Information Technology and Electronic Commerce

 comprised of the majority and minority chairs of the

 Communications and High Technology Committee of the Senate

 and the majority and minority chairs of the Information

 Technology Subcommittee of the Intergovernmental Relations

 Committee of the House of Representatives.
 - (2) The joint committee shall schedule and convene the meetings of the council and shall adopt such rules governing the organization and proceedings of the joint committee as they deem appropriate.
- 30 (3) Any member of the joint committee may request the

- council to consider and assess topics of interest related to
 information technology to that member.
- 3 (4) The joint committee shall also adopt such rules
 4 governing the organization and proceedings of the council as
 5 it deems appropriate.
- 6 (b) Chairmanship of committee.
- 7 (1) The chairmanship of the joint committee shall change 8 at the beginning of each session of the General Assembly and 9 shall rotate by party and by chamber.
- 10 (2) The House Republican member shall serve as chair of
 11 the joint committee immediately upon the effective date of
 12 this act.
- 13 (3) Unless the effective date of this act is the
 14 beginning date of a two year session of the General Assembly,
 15 the House Republican member shall continue to serve through
 16 the next complete two year session of the General Assembly.
- 17 (4) The House Democratic member shall serve as chair in
 18 the following two year legislative session, then the Senate
 19 Republican member, then the Senate Democratic member, and so
 20 on.
- 21 Section 8. Effective date.
- 22 This act shall take effect in 60 days.

- 23 SUBCOMMITTEE ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OF THE COMMITTEE ON

- 25 (B) CHAIRMAN.--
- 26 (1) THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL CHANGE AT THE
- 27 BEGINNING OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR AND SHALL ROTATE BY CAUCUS

- 26 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONIC
- 27 COMMERCE INDUSTRIES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, MEMBERS
- 28 REPRESENTING:
- 29 (I) PUBLIC, PRIVATE, FOR-PROFIT AND NOT-FOR-PRIVATE
- 30 ORGANIZATIONS.
