- 1 Recognizing the week of March 3 through 9, 2002, as "Newspaper
- 2 in Education Week" in Pennsylvania and encouraging the use of
- 3 newspapers in the classroom.
- WHEREAS, The week of March 3 through 9, 2002, has been
- 5 declared as "Newspaper in Education Week" to recognize the
- 6 importance of the use of newspapers as a teaching tool in the
- 7 classroom; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Newspapers across this Commonwealth participate in
- 9 the Newspaper in Education Program by providing copies of daily
- 10 editions at no cost or reduced cost to school districts; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Teachers and students have discovered that using
- 12 newspapers as teaching tools provides many benefits, including
- 13 increasing communications skills, improving language arts,
- 14 stimulating interest and intellect for current events and

- 1 opinion-editorial pages, providing information on local
- 2 artistic, educational, business, religious and athletic events
- 3 of interest and making students familiar with newspapers as a
- 4 major resource of information; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Because of the many benefits from doing so, use of
- 6 newspapers in the classroom must be encouraged and promoted;
