A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the month of May 2002 as "Mental Health Month" in 2 Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mental health is essential to everyone's overall
- 4 health and well-being; and

5 WHEREAS, One in five American adults and children is affected

6 by a mental illness; and

7 WHEREAS, Mental health problems do not discriminate and know

8 no race, creed, age limit or economic status; and

9 WHEREAS, People with mental illness can lead full, productive

10 lives; and

WHEREAS, An estimated two-thirds of adults and young people
 with mental health problems are not getting the help they need;
 and

WHEREAS, Untreated or undertreated mental illness costs
public and private employers billions of dollars annually
through absenteeism, turnover, low productivity and increased
medical costs; and

8 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is committed to 9 community-based systems of mental health care in which all 10 residents can receive high-quality and consumer-responsive 11 services; and

12 WHEREAS, The National Mental Health Association, the National 13 Council for Community Behavioral Healthcare and their national 14 partners observe "Mental Health Month" every May to raise 15 awareness and understanding of mental health and illness; 16 therefore be it

17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 18 month of May 2002 as "Mental Health Month" in Pennsylvania; and 19 be it further

20 RESOLVED, That all citizens, government agencies, public and 21 private institutions, businesses and schools be urged to 22 recommit our communities to increasing awareness and 23 understanding of mental illness and the need for appropriate and 24 accessible services for all people with mental illness.
