AN ACT

- 1 Establishing a program within the Department of Education to
- 2 provide grants to engineering degree-granting schools to
- assist in the acquisition of new engineering equipment or the
- 4 upgrading of existing engineering equipment that is necessary
- 5 to provide students with the courses required to obtain a
- 6 degree in engineering.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Short title.
- 10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Engineering
- 11 School Equipment Act.
- 12 Section 2. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 14 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 15 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 16 "Board." The board of directors of the Ben Franklin/IRC
- 17 Partnership under section 3 of the act of July 2, 1993 (P.L.439,
- 18 No.64), known as the Ben Franklin/IRC Partnership Act.
- 19 "Department." The Department of Education of the

- 1 Commonwealth.
- 2 "Engineering degree-granting school." An institution of
- 3 higher education which offers curriculum in engineering or
- 4 engineering technology which has been approved by the
- 5 Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology (ABET) and is
- 6 recognized as such by the State Registration Board for
- 7 Professional Engineers.
- 8 "Equipment." Basic instructional equipment of an engineering
- 9 nature used in the teaching of undergraduate or graduate
- 10 engineering or engineering technology.
- "Full-time equivalent engineering student." The enrollment
- 12 in baccalaureate and graduate programs of engineering schools
- 13 expressed in terms of full-time students as determined by the
- 14 department.
- 15 Section 3. Engineering equipment acquisition and upgrade.
- 16 (a) Program. -- There is established within the department a
- 17 program to provide grants to engineering degree-granting
- 18 schools. The program shall be administered by the board. Funds
- 19 provided through this program shall be used exclusively for the
- 20 acquisition of new engineering equipment and the upgrading of
- 21 existing engineering equipment that is necessary to provide
- 22 students with the courses required to obtain a baccalaureate or
- 23 graduate engineering degree. The board shall:
- 24 (1) Promulgate such policies, develop such forms and
- institute such procedures as may be necessary to implement
- 26 this act.
- 27 (2) Allocate to each engineering school funds for which
- it is eligible under this act.
- 29 (3) Approve or disapprove any request for expenditures
- for the purchase or upgrading of equipment.

- 1 (4) Require such information and records from each
- 2 engineering school as it deems necessary.
- 3 (5) Request the department to certify to the board the
- 4 full-time equivalent enrollment of baccalaureate and graduate
- 5 engineering students at each engineering school in the most
- 6 recent year for which data are available.
- 7 (b) Allocation of funds. -- The funds appropriated for
- 8 utilization pursuant to this act shall be allocated by the board
- 9 for grants to the engineering degree-granting schools based on
- 10 the ratio of full-time equivalent students enrolled in
- 11 baccalaureate and graduate engineering programs at each school
- 12 to the total number of full-time equivalent undergraduate and
- 13 graduate engineering students in this Commonwealth.
- 14 (c) Expenditure of funds.--All grants made to engineering
- 15 degree-granting schools shall be expended only for equipment. No
- 16 engineering school shall expend any grant funds on equipment
- 17 unless it also expends funds obtained from private sources on
- 18 that equipment. At least \$1 of private funds shall be required
- 19 for each \$1 of grant funds from this program paid to engineering
- 20 degree-granting schools. Grants made under this act shall not be
- 21 used to supplant existing Federal, State or local funds for the
- 22 acquisition or upgrading of engineering equipment. As used in
- 23 this subsection the term "private funds" shall include funds
- 24 obtained from corporate foundations.
- 25 (d) Distribution of unused funds. -- Any allocated funds which
- 26 have not been expended consistent with subsection (c) by June 30
- 27 of each year shall be available for reallocation by the board.
- 28 Section 4. Indicators of program impact.
- 29 The department shall report to the General Assembly by March
- 30 31, 2002, and each March 31 thereafter, on the impact of the

- 1 program, including the types of equipment funded and the amount
- 2 of private sector matching funds generated. All recipients of
- 3 grants under this act shall provide information requested by the
- 4 department for the purposes of this report.
- 5 Section 5. Appropriation.
- 6 The sum of \$2,000,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 7 necessary, is hereby appropriated to the Department of Education
- 8 to carry out the provisions of this act.
- 9 Section 6. Expiration.
- 10 This act shall expire June 30, 2006.
- 11 Section 7. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect immediately.
