AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 3 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 5 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 7 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 13 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 15 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 17 and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 19 20 commissions shall be determined, " increasing the complement 21 of the Pennsylvania State Police. 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. Section 205(b) of the act of April 9, 1929 25 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, amended July 11, 1991 (P.L.73, No.12), is amended to read: 26

Section 205. Pennsylvania State Police. -- * * *

- 1 (b) The State Police Force shall consist of such number of
- 2 officers and men, and shall be organized in such manner, as the
- 3 Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police, with the approval of
- 4 the Governor, shall from time to time determine: Provided,
- 5 however, That the number of officers and men shall not exceed in
- 6 the aggregate at any time [three thousand nine hundred and
- 7 forty] <u>five thousand</u> persons. State policemen, both officers and
- 8 men, assigned to duty with the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission
- 9 or assigned to duty as resident State troopers, shall not be
- 10 counted in determining the total number of officers and men in
- 11 the State Police Force.

- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
