A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
- of Pennsylvania, providing for spending limitations on the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with the provisions of
- 8 Article XI:
- 9 That Article VIII be amended by adding a section to read:
- 10 § 18. Spending limitations.
- 11 (a) Total spending by the Commonwealth shall not exceed the
- 12 spending limit in any fiscal year. The spending limit for any
- 13 fiscal year shall be equal to the spending during the
- 14 immediately prior fiscal year, adjusted by the lower percentage
- 15 of the following:
- 16 (1) 100% of the average annual rate of change for the
- 17 two preceding years of personal income in Pennsylvania as

- 1 reported by the Federal Government or as determined pursuant
- 2 <u>to an act of the General Assembly; or</u>
- 3 (2) 5%.
- 4 The percentage of the rate of change used in any fiscal year to
- 5 adjust the limit may be increased for that year, but not to a
- 6 percentage in excess of 120% of clause (1) or (2), whichever is
- 7 lower, by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members
- 8 <u>elected to each House of the General Assembly. The</u>
- 9 Commonwealth's spending limit as provided in this subsection may
- 10 be changed by the procedure outlined in section 1(a) of Article
- 11 <u>XI.</u>
- 12 (b) The spending limit of the Commonwealth may be exceeded
- 13 <u>in any fiscal year for a presidentially declared emergency or</u>
- 14 major disaster. The spending limit may also be exceeded for
- 15 other declared emergencies if the Governor so requests and the
- 16 General Assembly approves by the affirmative vote of two-thirds
- 17 of the members elected to each House of the General Assembly.
- 18 The excess spending authorized by exceeding the limit in this
- 19 manner shall not be included in the computation base of the
- 20 <u>spending limit for any subsequent fiscal year.</u>
- 21 (c) Total spending by the Commonwealth means all
- 22 appropriations and authorizations from the General Fund, the
- 23 Public Transportation Assistance Fund and the Motor License Fund
- 24 and funds created after the effective date of this amendment,
- 25 and shall exclude refunds, servicing of bonded indebtedness
- 26 incurred prior to the effective date of this amendment and of
- 27 voter-approved bonded indebtedness, expenditures for funding the
- 28 <u>unfunded pension liabilities existing on the effective date of</u>
- 29 this amendment, and the spending of Federal funds, gifts or
- 30 receipts restricted by laws in effect as of January 1, 1997.

- 1 This section shall not be circumvented by creating additional
- 2 spending programs in, or transferring spending from the General
- 3 Fund or Motor License Fund to, existing special funds or
- 4 restricted receipt accounts.
- 5 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General
- 6 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
- 7 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 8 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 9 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 10 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 11 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 12 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.
- 13 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this
- 14 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the
- 15 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 16 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 17 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 18 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 19 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 20 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the
- 21 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment
- 22 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 23 primary, general or municipal election occurring at least three
- 24 months after the proposed constitutional amendment is passed by
- 25 the General Assembly.
- 26 Section 3. The addition of section 18(a) of Article VIII of
- 27 the Constitution of Pennsylvania shall become effective
- 28 beginning with the first fiscal year commencing more than six
- 29 months following approval of section 18 by the electorate.
