## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 7, 1980 (P.L.380, No.97), entitled "An 2 act providing for the planning and regulation of solid waste 3 storage, collection, transportation, processing, treatment, and disposal; requiring municipalities to submit plans for 4 5 municipal waste management systems in their jurisdictions; 6 authorizing grants to municipalities; providing regulation of 7 the management of municipal, residual and hazardous waste; 8 requiring permits for operating hazardous waste and solid 9 waste storage, processing, treatment, and disposal facilities; and licenses for transportation of hazardous 10 11 waste; imposing duties on persons and municipalities; granting powers to municipalities; authorizing the 12 13 Environmental Quality Board and the Department of 14 Environmental Resources to adopt rules, regulations, standards and procedures; granting powers to and imposing 15 duties upon county health departments; providing remedies; 16 17 prescribing penalties; and establishing a fund, " requiring 18 the department to make certain findings with regard to 19 applications for specific facilities. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
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- 21 hereby enacts as follows:
- 22 Section 1. Section 503(c) of the act of July 7, 1980
- 23 (P.L.380, No.97), known as the Solid Waste Management Act, is
- 24 amended to read:
- 25 Section 503. Granting, denying, renewing, modifying, revoking
- 26 and suspending permits and licenses.

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       (c) In carrying out the provisions of this act, the
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    department may deny, suspend, modify, or revoke any permit or
    license if it finds that:
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           (1) the applicant, permittee or licensee has failed or
       continues to fail to comply with:
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               (i) any provision of this act,
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               (ii) any provision of any of the following acts:
                   (A) the act of June 22, 1937 (P.L.1987, No.394),
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               known as "The Clean Streams Law,"
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                   (B) the act of January 8, 1960 (1959 P.L.2119,
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               No.787), known as the "Air Pollution Control Act,"
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               and
                   (C) the act of November 26, 1978 (P.L.1375,
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               No.325), known as the "Dam Safety and Encroachments
               Act, [or]
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               (iii) any other state or Federal statute relating to
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           environmental protection or to the protection of the
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           public health, safety and welfare; [or]
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               (iv) any rule or regulation of the department; [or]
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               (v) any order of the department; [or]
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               (vi) any condition of any permit or license issued
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           by the department; or
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           (2) [if the department finds that] the applicant,
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       permittee or licensee has shown a lack of ability or
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       intention to comply with any provision of this act or any of
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       the acts referred to in this subsection or any rule or
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       regulation of the department or order of the department, or
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       any condition of any permit or license issued by the
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       department as indicated by past or continuing violations. The
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- department shall find that an applicant has shown a lack of
- 2 <u>ability or intention to comply with the provisions of this</u>
- 3 act with regard to an application for a specific facility on
- 4 <u>a specific site when that applicant has filed at least two</u>
- 5 permit applications for a specific facility on a specific
- 6 <u>site that were denied or not administratively complete within</u>
- 7 <u>one year of the final departmental request for information</u>
- 8 <u>from the applicant.</u>
- 9 In the case of a corporate applicant, permittee or licensee, the
- 10 department may deny the issuance of a license or permit if it
- 11 finds that a principal of the corporation was a principal of
- 12 another corporation which committed past violations of this act.

- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
