## A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of October 1 through 7, 2002, as "Long-Term Care Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The Federal Medicare program does not provide for
- 4 long-term care costs; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Medicaid program, jointly funded by Federal and
- 6 state governments, only pays for long-term care after assets are
- 7 depleted; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The current cost of long-term care ranges from
- 9 \$22,000 to \$84,000 per year; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Those persons who have saved for retirement have, on
- 11 the average, saved only \$34,000; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Only a small percentage of the population can
- 13 accurately estimate the cost of long-term care; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Only about 8% of the population has long-term care
- 15 insurance; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Advocates for and providers of long-term care are

- 1 actively engaged in helping to educate the public on long-term
- 2 care using the theme "Conversation, Action, Reform and
- 3 Experiences" or "C.A.R.E."; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Recent studies have shown that there is reluctance
- 5 in families to discuss the need for long-term care services and
- 6 the wishes of the spouse, sibling or child who may need those
- 7 services; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the week of October 1
- 9 through 7, 2002, as "Long-Term Care Awareness Week" in
- 10 Pennsylvania and urge all citizens to learn about long-term care
- 11 options including the need for long-term care insurance; and be
- 12 it further
- RESOLVED, That the Senate continue to address comprehensive
- 14 strategies for the delivery of accessible and adequately funded
- 15 programs for vulnerable citizens in need of long-term care and
- 16 services.
