Providing for special and commemorative registration plates, for criteria for creation of the plates, for the duties of the Department of Transportation and for fees; establishing funds related to certain registration plates; and making repeals.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

CHAPTER 1
GENERAL PROVISIONS
Section 101. Short title.
This act shall be known and may be cited as the Specialty

License Plate Act.
Section 102. Definitions.
The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
"Department." The Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth.
"Sponsoring organization." A government or nonprofit organization named in this act that has entered into an agreement with the department regarding plates covered by this act.

Section 103. Publication of notice.
The department shall publish notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin and otherwise make available to the general public information that donations to a sponsoring organization are a qualifying expenditure for the plate identified in the notice. Section 104. Fees.

Unless otherwise provided for in this act, annual registration fees shall be as prescribed under 75 Pa.C.S. (relating to vehicles). Section 105. Special registration plates generally.
(a) General rule.--Upon request by the applicant, the department may issue registration plates consisting of any combination of numbers, letters or numbers and letters. These special plates may be issued for special groups or for special purposes and bear an appropriate designation.
(b) Fee authorized.--Special groups may charge a fee for authorization to request a registration plate bearing the name of the group, which plates shall have the same force and effect as regular registration plates.
(c) Rules and regulations.--The department may refuse any combination of letters and numbers for cause and shall adopt reasonable rules and regulations for the issuance of the plates and for carrying out the provisions of this section.
(d) Applicant obligations.--The applicant shall comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to registration including the payment of any additional fees.
(e) Reissuance.--The department is authorized to reissue a combination of numbers or letters for a personal plate if:
(1) The department records reveal that no activity such as renewal or transfer of the personal registration plate has occurred for a period of five or more consecutive years.
(2) The personal registration plate was never reported as lost or stolen.

Whenever the department reissues an inactive personal plate, the department may purge its records of all references to the previous owners of that personal plate. The department shall, however, note upon its records the reissuance of the personal plate and to whom the plate was issued.
(f) Use of special registration plates.--Unless otherwise stated, a special registration plate may be used only on a passenger car, motor home, trailer or truck with a registered gross weight of not more than 9,000 pounds.

CHAPTER 3
SPECIAL FUND REGISTRATION PLATES
Section 301. Special fund registration plate requirements.
An organization which sponsors a special registration plate under this chapter for which a portion of the registration fee is dedicated to a special fund shall comply with the following:
(1) The sponsoring organization must submit a letter of
request to the department describing the proposed purpose and details concerning the recipient of fund moneys. The letter of request must include a proposed graphic design of the special fund registration plate.
(2) The sponsoring organization must sign a memorandum of understanding with the department associated with the initial procurement of special fund registration plates and any subsequent procurement.
(3) After ten years all plates may be recalled or replaced at the discretion of the department.
(4) The sponsoring organization shall acknowledge in writing that the proposed graphic design must be approved by the Pennsylvania State Police and the special fund group tag committee established on an ad hoc basis by notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
(5) The sponsoring organization may elect to retire an existing design of a special fund registration plate and replace it with one new design after the department has issued 200,000 of the initial design. Only one redesign shall be permitted. Any subsequent plate redesign by a sponsoring organization must meet the same requirements provided in this section.
(6) The department at its discretion may discontinue issuing a special fund registration plate if within any full calendar year of issuance fewer than 5,000 special fund registration plates are issued.
(7) A sponsoring organization must meet the requirements of this section within one year of enactment of a law authorizing the organization's special fund registration plate.

Section 302. Wild resource conservation plate.
The department, in consultation with the Wild Resource Conservation Board, shall design a special wild resource conservation registration plate. Upon application of any person, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 35$, which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee the department shall issue the plate. The Wild Resource Conservation Fund shall receive $\$ 15$ of each additional fee for this plate. Section 303. Preserve our heritage registration plate.

The department, in consultation with the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, shall design a special preserve our heritage registration plate. Upon receipt of an application, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 35$, which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee, the department shall issue the plate. The Historical Preservation Fund shall receive \$15 of each additional fee for this plate. Section 304. Zoological plate.
(a) Design and issuance.--The department, in consultation with the Pennsylvania Zoological Council, shall design a special zoological registration plate. Upon application of any person, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 35$, which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee, the department shall issue the plate. The Zoological Enhancement Fund shall receive $\$ 15$ of each additional fee for this plate.
(b) Zoological Enhancement Fund.--Fifteen dollars of each fee received under this section shall be credited to the Zoological Enhancement Fund created as follows:
(1) There is hereby established a special account in the State Treasury which shall be known as the Zoological Enhancement Fund. The purpose of the Zoological Enhancement

Fund is to assist Commonwealth nonprofit zoological institutions accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association and licensed by the United States Department of Agriculture to fulfill their conservation, education and recreation missions to the citizens of this Commonwealth.
(2) All moneys in the Zoological Enhancement Fund are hereby annually appropriated to the Department of Community and Economic Development and may be expended for the purposes authorized under this subsection.
(3) Estimates of amounts to be expended under this subsection shall be submitted to the Governor by the Department of Community and Economic Development for his approval.
(4) The State Treasurer shall not honor any requisition for expenditures by the Department of Community and Economic Development in excess of estimates approved by the Governor or in excess of the amount available for the purposes for which the requisition was made, whichever is the lesser amount.

Section 305. DARE plate.
(a) Design and issuance.--The department, in consultation with the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, shall design a special drug abuse resistance education (DARE) registration plate which utilizes the DARE logo or slogan in the design. Upon application of any person, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 35$, which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee, the department shall issue the plate. The Drug Abuse Resistance Education Program shall receive $\$ 15$ of each additional fee for this plate.
(b) Drug Abuse Resistance Education Fund.--Fifteen dollars
of each fee received under subsection (a) shall be credited to the Drug Abuse Resistance Education Fund established as follows:
(1) There is hereby established a special account in the State Treasury which shall be known as the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Fund. The purpose of the DARE Fund is to provide moneys for an ongoing educational program in public schools to prevent drug abuse, utilizing police agency representatives, school district employees, materials, supplies and other necessary expenses associated with the program.
(2) All moneys in the DARE Fund are hereby annually appropriated to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency and may be expended for the purposes authorized under this subsection.
(3) Estimates of amounts to be expended under this subsection shall be submitted to the Governor by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency for his approval.
(4) The State Treasurer shall not honor any requisition for expenditures by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency in excess of estimates approved by the Governor or in excess of the amount available for the purposes for which the requisition was made, whichever is the lesser amount.

## CHAPTER 5

PERSONAL SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES
Section 501. Personal special registration plates.
(a) General rule.--The department may, upon application of any person and upon payment of the additional fee under this section, issue a personal special registration plate to
applicants for special plates authorized in this act.
(b) Additional fee.--
(1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3), the department shall collect an additional fee of up to $\$ 150$ for any personal special registration plate issued under subsection (a).
(2) For any personal plate issued under Chapter 3, the department shall retain one-fourth of the fee and threefourths of the fee shall be deposited in the funds as provided in sections 302, 303, 304 and 305.
(3) For any personal plate issued under section 502 and 75 Pa.C.S. §§ 1338 (relating to person with disability plate and placard) and 1342 (relating to veteran plates and placard), the department shall collect only an additional fee of $\$ 20$.

Section 502. Hearing impaired plates.
On the application of any person with a hearing impairment, verified by a licensed physician and accompanied by the appropriate fee, the department shall issue to that person a special registration plate designating the vehicle as belonging to a person who has a hearing impairment, which plate shall have the same effect as a regular registration plate.

CHAPTER 7
GROUP PLATES
Section 701. Authorized group plates.
The department shall develop designs for the plates described in this chapter in consultation with the sponsoring organization. An organization which sponsors a special registration plate authorized in this chapter shall comply with the following:
(1) The sponsoring organization or organizations must submit a letter of request to the department describing the proposed purpose and details concerning the use of funds designated related to compliance with this act. The letter of request must include a proposed graphic design of the authorized group plate.
(2) The sponsoring organization or organizations must sign a memorandum of understanding with the department associated with the initial procurement of plates and any subsequent procurement. The sponsoring organization or organizations shall be responsible initially for a minimum of 300 plates.
(3) After ten years all plates may be recalled or replaced at the discretion of the department.
(4) The sponsoring organization shall acknowledge in writing that the proposed graphic design must be approved by the Pennsylvania State Police and the special fund group tag committee established on an ad hoc basis by notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
(5) The sponsoring organization may elect to retire an existing design of a plate and replace it with one new design after the department has issued 200,000 of the initial design. Only one redesign shall be permitted. Any subsequent plate redesign by a sponsoring organization must meet the same requirements provided in this section.
(6) The department at its discretion may discontinue issuing an authorized group registration plate if within any full calendar year of issuance fewer than 300 registration plates are issued.
(7) A sponsoring organization must meet the requirements
of this section within one year of enactment of a law authorizing the organization's group registration plate. Section 702. Youth hunter and angler education plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, the following:
(1) The Pennsylvania Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs.
(2) The Unified Sportsmen of Pennsylvania.
(3) The United Bowhunters of Pennsylvania.
(4) The National Rifle Association.
(5) The Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Wild Turkey Federation.
(6) The Pennsylvania Chapter of Trout Unlimited.
(7) The Pennsylvania Sportsmen for Youth.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely to assist this Commonwealth's nonprofit sportsmen's clubs, Commonwealth natural resource agencies and other organizations in conducting youth field days, conservation schools and other related hunter or trapper or angler youth education programs.

Section 703. Animal protection plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization,
accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include:
(1) Any organization that is dedicated to assist this Commonwealth's nonprofit organizations that provide low-cost dog or cat spaying or neutering services.
(2) A nonprofit organization that maintains a shelter for unwanted, stray or relinquished animals.
(3) An organization that provides emergency care for unwanted, stray or relinquished animals.
(4) Nonprofit organizations that enforce Pennsylvania's cruelty to animals law under 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511 (relating to cruelty to animals).

Section 704. Gettysburg Civil War Memorial plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate which shall have a replica of the main Pennsylvania monument at the Gettysburg National Military Park and shall display the words "Gettysburg 1863" designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to:
(1) The National Park Service.
(2) The Pennsylvania Monuments at Gettysburg National Military Park Fund.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely to preserve and restore the Pennsylvania monuments and sites surrounding the monuments. Section 705. Kids first plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, the Children's Trust Fund Board, established under the act of December 15, 1988 (P.L.1235, No.151), known as the Children's Trust Fund Act.
(c) Grants.--
(1) The money collected and credited to the Children's Trust Fund under this section shall be designated as demonstration grants to county children and youth programs for community-based child abuse and neglect prevention services, except that grants made from funds made available under this subsection shall not be subject to the usual local match requirements of the Children's Trust Fund and family support services. In addition to specific programs identified as eligible for grants under the Children's Trust Fund Act, services funded by money collected under this subsection
shall also include the development of court-appointed special advocate programs for children, otherwise known as CASA.
(2) In order to qualify for a grant funded by money collected under this section, a county children and youth agency must demonstrate to the Children's Trust Fund Board that:
(i) The services reflect the unmet needs of children and families in the community.
(ii) The programs contribute to the coordination of local services for children and families.
(iii) The program could not be funded through existing Federal or State programs.
(3) To the fullest extent possible, the Children's Trust Fund Board shall ensure the equitable geographic distribution of the funds to county children and youth programs across this Commonwealth.

Section 706. Cancer research plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to:
(1) The Pennsylvania Cancer Control, Prevention and Research Advisory Board of the Department of Health.
(2) The American Cancer Society.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under
this section shall be used solely for purposes of cancer research.

Section 707. Coal heritage commemorative registration plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission for nonprofit and government-owned coal mining sites and museums and their affiliate tunnels. The commission shall administer the funds contributed as follows:
(1) To promote coal heritage.
(2) To preserve, maintain and operate nonprofit and government-owned coal mining sites and museums and their affiliate tunnels.

Section 708. Independence National Historical Park plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include:
(1) Eastern National.
(2) Independence National Historical Park of the United States National Park Service.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely to assist and support educational programs sponsored through the Independence National Historical Park's history education center, known as the Independence Park Institute, which promotes tourism and educates visitors on the founding of this nation at Independence Hall in Philadelphia.

Section 709. Volunteer firefighter's plate.
Upon application of any person serving as a member in good standing of a volunteer fire department, accompanied by a fee of \$20 which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed. A qualifying person is limited to one such plate regardless of the number of vehicles registered. Section 710. Saving children plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed. The department shall design a saving children registration plate with likenesses of children of different races and ethnic backgrounds.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations
eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, any organization that would assist with the payment for extracurricular activities in public schools.

Section 711. Emergency services plate.
Upon application of any person serving as an emergency services worker, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to an emergency services worker. A qualifying person is limited to one such plate regardless of the number of vehicles registered.

Section 712. Breast cancer awareness plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, the Susan G. Komen Foundation.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely for research, education, screening and treatment of breast cancer. Section 713. Pennsylvania agriculture plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the
annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include the Department of Agriculture for:
(1) Agricultural education programs.
(2) Transfer to the Agricultural Conservation Easement Purchase Fund established pursuant to the act of June 30, 1981 (P.L.128, No.43), known as the Agricultural Area Security Law.

No funds allocated from proceeds shall be used for administrative or general government expenses. Section 714. Pennsylvania Irish Caucus plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, the Pennsylvania Irish Caucus.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely for a Irish Famine Memorial. Section 715. Friend for life plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization,
accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include nonprofit adoption agencies that do not promote abortion as an alternative. Section 716. Chesapeake Bay commemorative plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to:
(1) The Chesapeake Bay Commission.
(2) The Department of Environmental Protection.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely to assist with stream restoration projects in the Chesapeake Bay watershed in this Commonwealth.

Section 717. Pride in America plate.
Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 50$ to a sponsoring organization or relief fund which benefits victims of terrorism or war, served as a rescue or recovery worker for victims of terrorism or war any time beginning September 11, 2001, or thereafter, or contributed to the Rewards
for Justice Fund of the Department of State, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed or served.

Section 718. Steelworkers plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who is a steelworker, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and by documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a steelworker. The plate shall bear the likeness of the official emblem of the American Iron and Steel Institute.
(b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "steelworker" means a person currently or formerly employed in the manufacture of steel or a surviving member of the steelworker's family.

Section 719. Legislative plate.
Upon application by a member or retired member of the Congress of the United States, the General Assembly of the Commonwealth or the department may issue special registration plates indicating that the vehicle is owned by a member or retired member of the United States Senate or Pennsylvania Senate or House of Representatives, as appropriate. Section 720. Library registration plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the
annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to:
(1) Public libraries.
(2) The Department of Education.
(3) District library centers' advisory councils.

Section 721. Ruffed grouse plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include the Pennsylvania Game Commission.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall only be used by the commission for forest habitat management and educational programs relating to the ruffed grouse.

Section 722. Lighthouse preservation plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a
special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall only be used by the commission. Section 723. Choose life plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include, but are not limited to, Choose Life, Inc.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall only be used to pay for programs offered by certain crisis pregnancy centers.

Section 724. Civilian Conservation Corps worker plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has served in the Civilian Conservation Corps, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Definition.--As used in this section, the term "Civilian

Conservation Corps worker" means a person currently or formerly employed by the Civilian Conservation Corps or Pennsylvania Conservation Corps or a surviving member of the person's family. Section 725. Organ donor plate.

Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to the Organ Donation Awareness Trust Fund accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed. Section 726. Prostate cancer research plate.
(a) Issuance.--Upon application of any person who has contributed at least $\$ 20$ to an eligible sponsoring organization, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.
(b) Eligible organizations.--Sponsoring organizations eligible under this section include the American Cancer Society.
(c) Authorized use of fees.--Additional fees collected under this section shall be used solely for purposes of prostate cancer research.

SECTION 727. AUTISM AWARENESS AND RESEARCH PLATE.
(A) ISSUANCE.--UPON APPLICATION OF ANY PERSON WHO HAS CONTRIBUTED AT LEAST $\$ 20$ TO AN ELIGIBLE SPONSORING ORGANIZATION, ACCOMPANIED BY A FEE OF $\$ 20$ WHICH SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEE AND DOCUMENTATION AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE TO THE PERSON A

SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE DESIGNATING THE VEHICLE SO LICENSED AS BELONGING TO A PERSON WHO HAS SO CONTRIBUTED.
(B) ELIGIBLE ORGANIZATIONS.--SPONSORING ORGANIZATIONS ELIGIBLE UNDER THIS SECTION INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE PENNSYLVANIA ACTION COALITION FOR AUTISM SERVICES.
(C) AUTHORIZED USE OF FEES.--ADDITIONAL FEES COLLECTED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE USED SOLELY FOR RESEARCH, EDUCATION, SCREENING AND TREATMENT OF AUTISM.

CHAPTER 9
LIMITED USE SPECIAL VEHICLE PLATES
Section 901. Antique, classic and collectible plates.
Upon submission by a vehicle owner of information satisfactory to the department that a motorcycle or motor vehicle is an antique motorcycle or motor vehicle or classic motorcycle or motor vehicle or collectible motorcycle or motor vehicle, accompanied by the appropriate fee, the department may issue special plates for the motorcycle or vehicle. The applicant shall provide photographic proof in a manner specified by the department to demonstrate the condition of the motor vehicle. No annual registration fee may be charged for antique, collectible or classic motorcycles or motor vehicles. Section 902. Street rod plate.

Upon submission by a vehicle owner of information satisfactory to the department that a motor vehicle is a street rod, accompanied by the appropriate fee, the department shall issue special plates for the vehicle, which shall have the same force and effect as regular registration plates. The applicant shall comply with all laws and regulations pertaining to registration, including the payment of any additional fees. CHAPTER 11

Upon application of any person who is a veteran of the Korean War, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and by documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a veteran of the Korean War.

Section 1106. Special plates for veterans of Persian Gulf War.
Upon application of any person who is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and by documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War.

Section 1107. Prisoner of war plate.
On the application of an ex-prisoner of war whose imprisonment while in the service of the armed forces of the United States is certified by the appropriate branch of the armed forces, the department shall issue a special registration plate designating the vehicle as belonging to an ex-prisoner of war. The registration plate shall contain the letters "POW" and such other numbers or letters as the department may determine and shall have the words "prisoner of war" in at least ten-point bold type inscribed at the bottom of the plate. Only one special registration plate shall be issued to an ex-prisoner of war under this section.

Section 1108. Vietnam Conflict veterans.
Upon application of any person who is a veteran of the Vietnam Conflict as that term is defined for the awarding of the

Vietnam Service Medal, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ in addition to the annual registration fee and by documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a veteran of the Vietnam Conflict.

Section 1109. Medal of Honor recipients.
Upon application of any person who is a recipient of the Medal of Honor, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a recipient of the Medal of Honor. The plate shall have a light blue background interspersed with 13 white stars. The center of the plate shall bear a golden bronze replica of the appropriate medal. The initials of each recipient shall be embossed in red to the left of the medal and the letters "CMH" (for Congressional Medal of Honor) shall be embossed in red to the right of the medal. Section 1110. Purple Heart recipients.

Upon application of any person who is a recipient of the Purple Heart, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a recipient of the Purple Heart. A severely disabled veteran, as described in 75 Pa.C.S. § 1342 (b) (relating to veteran plates and placard), who is qualified to receive a plate under this section may also elect to receive a placard under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1342 (b).

Section 1111. Distinguished Flying Cross recipients.
Upon application of any person who is a recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and
documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who has so contributed.

Section 1112. Missing in Action plate.
Upon application of any person, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$, which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate honoring those members of the United States Armed Forces who the Department of Defense has determined to be missing in action. The plate shall have a black background with white letters and/or numbers. The registration plate shall contain the letters "MIA" and other numbers or letters as the department may determine and shall have the words "YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN" in at least ten-point bold type inscribed at the bottom of the plate. Section 1113. Submarine service plate.

Upon application of any person who is a veteran of a submarine crew, accompanied by a fee of $\$ 20$ which shall be in addition to the annual registration fee and by documentation as the department shall require, the department shall issue to the person a special registration plate designating the vehicle so licensed as belonging to a person who is a veteran of a United States submarine crew.

SECTION 1114. LIBERATION OF IRAQ VETERANS PLATE.
UPON APPLICATION OF ANY PERSON wHO IS A VETERAN OF THE LIBERATION OF IRAQ, ACCOMPANIED BY A FEE OF $\$ 20$, WHICH SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEE AND BY DOCUMENTATION AS THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE TO THE PERSON A SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATE DESIGNATING THE VEHICLE SO LICENSED AS BELONGING TO A PERSON WHO IS A VETERAN OF THE
