## AN ACT

Amending the act of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), entitled "An act relating to the manufacture, sale and possession of 2 3 controlled substances, other drugs, devices and cosmetics; conferring powers on the courts and the secretary and Department of Health, and a newly created Pennsylvania Drug, 5 Device and Cosmetic Board; establishing schedules of 7 controlled substances; providing penalties; requiring registration of persons engaged in the drug trade and for the revocation or suspension of certain licenses and 9 10 registrations; and repealing an act, "further providing for 11 prohibited acts and penalties. 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. Section 13(f)(1) of the act of April 14, 1972 15 (P.L.233, No.64), known as The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act, amended December 14, 1984 (P.L.988, 17 No.200), is amended to read: 18 Section 13. Prohibited Acts; Penalties. -- \* \* \* 19 (f) Any person who violates clause (12), (14) or (30) of subsection (a) with respect to: 20 21 (1) A controlled substance or counterfeit substance
