9 Section 1. Short title.

10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the [Police 11 Officer, Firefighter, Correction Employee and National Guard 12 Member] Child Beneficiary Education Act.

Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:

15 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:

16 (1) Pennsylvania's law enforcement officers,

6 Section 4. Sections 3 and 8 of the act are amended to read: 7 Section 3. Postsecondary Educational Gratuity Program. 8 (a) Establishment.--There is hereby established the 9 Postsecondary Educational Gratuity Program for children of 10 [police] <u>law enforcement</u> officers, firefighters, correction 11 employees and National Guard members of this Commonwealth who 12 are killed while acting in the performance of their duties.

(b) Eligibility.--

14 (1) Police officers, SHERIFFS AND DEPUTY SHERIFFS shall
15 be deemed to have been killed in the performance of their
16 duties if death results from job-related injuries sustained
17 or inflicted while performing any of the following:

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(i) Answering an emergency call.

(ii) Conducting interrogations of crime suspects or
 interrogations pursuant to a response to an emergency
 call.

## (VI) SERVING PROCESS OR EXECUTING ORDERS.

29 (2) Firefighters shall be deemed to have been killed in
30 the performance of their duties if death results from job20030H0409B3742 - 4 -

related injuries sustained or inflicted while performing any
 of the following:

(i) Being present at the scene of a fire or going to
and from a fire. In the case of volunteer firefighters,
going to and from a fire shall include traveling from and
directly returning to the firefighter's home, place of
business or other location where the firefighter was when
the fire call or alarm was received for a fire which the
firefighter's volunteer fire company attended.

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(ii) Answering an emergency call.

13 (3) A member of the National Guard shall be deemed to 14 have been killed in the performance of his or her duties if 15 his or her death results from performance of a duty required 16 by his or her orders or commander while in an official duty 17 status other than on Federal active duty.

18 (4) Correction employees shall be deemed to have been 19 killed in the performance of their duties if death results 20 from job-related injuries sustained or inflicted while 21 maintaining order and security or otherwise carrying out 22 their duties at a correctional facility.

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1 [(7)] (8) A child who is 25 years of age or younger at 2 the time of the child's application for participation in this 3 program and who meets all other eligibility requirements may 4 receive an educational gratuity for up to five years provided 5 the child otherwise continues to be eligible for 6 participation.

7 (c) Scope of benefit.--

8 (1) The benefit available under this section shall be 9 provided only for full-time students who are pursuing 10 undergraduate studies leading to an associate degree or a 11 baccalaureate degree.

12 (2) A child becomes eligible for this benefit after he 13 or she has applied for available scholarships and Federal and 14 State grants to cover tuition and room and board costs. The 15 child must provide a record of application for such financial 16 aid to the community college or State-owned or State-related 17 institution to which he or she is applying.

18 (3) A community college or a State-owned or State-19 related institution shall waive all remaining tuition and 20 room and board charges (total tuition, room and board and 21 fees minus awarded scholarships and Federal and State grants) 22 for an eligible child during the time the child is enrolled 23 as a full-time student provided the child meets all 24 requirements for admission to the community college or State-25 owned or State-related institution and during the child's 26 enrollment complies with all requirements of the institution 27 for continued attendance and award of an associate degree or 28 a baccalaureate degree.

29 (d) Administration.--

30 (1) Copies of all [police] <u>law enforcement</u> officer and 20030H0409B3742 - 7 - firefighter death certifications received by the Department of General Services under the act of June 24, 1976 (P.L.424, No.101), referred to as the Emergency and Law Enforcement Personnel Death Benefits Act, shall be provided by the Department of General Services to PHEAA within 20 days of their receipt.

7 (2) Written notification of the death of any correction
8 employee killed in the performance of his or her duties shall
9 be submitted to PHEAA by the Secretary of Corrections within
10 20 days of the death of the employee.

11 (3) Written notification of the death of any member of 12 the National Guard killed in the performance of his or her 13 duties shall be submitted to PHEAA by the Adjutant General of 14 the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs within 20 15 days of the death of the National Guard member.

Applications for an educational gratuity shall be 16 (4) 17 submitted to PHEAA by the child or the surviving parent or 18 guardian of the child, together with a certified copy of the 19 child's birth certificate or adoption record or other 20 documentation of birth or adoption acceptable to PHEAA. The application shall include a copy of the child's letter of 21 22 acceptance at a community college or a State-owned or State-23 related institution. If no death certification has been 24 received from the Department of General Services, Secretary 25 of Corrections or Adjutant General of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, PHEAA may elect to accept 26 27 other documentation certifying that the child's parent was a [police] <u>law enforcement</u> officer, firefighter, correction 28 29 employee or National Guard member killed during the performance of his or her duties. 30

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1 (5) Within 30 days of receipt of a completed 2 application, PHEAA shall send written notice to the child and 3 the community college or State-owned or State-related 4 institution of the child's eligibility or noneligibility for 5 participation in this program. If the child is determined not to be eligible for an educational gratuity, the notice shall 6 7 include the reason or reasons for such determination and an 8 indication that an appeal of PHEAA's determination may be 9 made pursuant to 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law 10 and procedure).

11 (6) Upon receipt of notification of the child's 12 eligibility from PHEAA, a community college or a State-owned 13 or State-related institution is prohibited from charging the child or the child's parent or guardian any tuition fee or 14 15 room and board charge. If moneys have been received by the community college or the State-owned or State-related 16 17 institution for these purposes, those moneys must be refunded 18 in full within 30 days of receipt by the community college or the State-owned or State-related institution of the notice of 19 20 the child's eligibility.

(7) Each community college or State-owned or Staterelated institution at which an eligible child is enrolled shall notify PHEAA upon the child's graduation or when the child is no longer enrolled at the community college or State-owned or State-related institution.

26 Section 8. Retroactivity.
