AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 24, 1931 (P.L.1206, No.331), entitled
- 2 "An act concerning townships of the first class; amending,
- 3 revising, consolidating, and changing the law relating
- 4 thereto, "further providing for acquisition of lands and
- 5 buildings.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 3001 of the act of June 24, 1931
- 9 (P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code,
- 10 reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P.L.1955, No.569) and
- 11 amended July 2, 1953 (P.L.321, No.69), is amended to read:
- 12 Section 3001. Acquisition of Lands and Buildings.--Townships
- 13 may, separately or jointly, by ordinance dedicate and set apart
- 14 lands not dedicated to other public uses or purposes, and may
- 15 enter upon, appropriate, and acquire, by gift, devise, purchase,
- 16 lease or otherwise, private property, for the purpose of making,
- 17 enlarging, and maintaining public parks, recreation areas and
- 18 facilities. The right to acquire lands or buildings for

- 1 recreational purposes through eminent domain shall exist only to
- 2 <u>acquire property reserved for future taking as shown on an</u>
- 3 official map of the township adopted pursuant to Article IV of
- 4 the act of July 31, 1968 (P.L.805, No.247), known as the
- 5 <u>"Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code," which official map</u>
- 6 shows elements of the township comprehensive plan, if any,
- 7 <u>adopted pursuant to Article III of the "Pennsylvania</u>
- 8 Municipalities Planning Code" and which elements are generally
- 9 <u>consistent with the county comprehensive plan.</u>
- 10 Townships may construct and equip new facilities upon such
- 11 lands and may levy and collect such taxes or special taxes as
- 12 may be necessary to pay for the same and make appropriations for
- 13 the construction, improvement, maintenance, care, regulation and
- 14 government of the same. All the costs and expenses relative to
- 15 any such property required by two or more townships jointly
- 16 shall be paid by the respective townships in such proportions as
- 17 may be agreed upon by the commissioners thereof.
- 18 Townships may likewise acquire private property within the
- 19 limits of another township, borough or city for the purpose
- 20 designated in this section, if the other township, borough or
- 21 city shall by ordinance signify its consent thereto.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
