AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 7, 1990 (P.L.639, No.165), entitled 2 "An act establishing a Statewide hazardous material safety 3 program; creating the Hazardous Material Response Fund; providing for the creation of Hazardous Material Emergency 5 Response Accounts in each county; further providing for the powers and duties of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management 6 7 Agency, of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Council and 8 of the counties and local governments; imposing obligations on certain handlers of hazardous materials; and imposing 9 penalties, "further providing for certified hazardous 10 material response teams. 11
- 12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 13 hereby enacts as follows:
- 14 Section 1. Section 209(a) of the act of December 7, 1990
- 15 (P.L.639, No.165), known as the Hazardous Material Emergency
- 16 Planning and Response Act, amended December 20, 2000 (P.L.885,
- 17 No.121), is amended to read:
- 18 Section 209. Certified hazardous material response teams.
- 19 (a) General rule. -- The council shall establish a program for

- 1 certifying hazardous material response teams, setting standards
- 2 for training, equipment, safety, operations and administration
- 3 of the teams. The certification program shall include, but not
- 4 be limited to:
- 5 (1) Standards for certifying response teams with several
- 6 preparedness levels patterned after levels established by the
- 7 United States Occupational Safety and Health Administration
- 8 at 29 CFR Part 1910.120.
- 9 (2) Reviewing existing hazardous material training and
- 10 certification programs to establish specific procedures for
- 11 crediting that training and certification under the program
- 12 established by this section.
- 13 (3) Reviewing the existing standards for the training
- 14 <u>and equipment needed to prepare regional hazardous material</u>
- organizations to respond to biological and chemical
- 16 emergencies that are a result of a terrorist incident.

- 18 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
