AN ACT

Amending the act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), entitled "A supplement to the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), 2 3 entitled "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth 5 by the Executive Department thereof and the administrative 6 departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, 7 including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and 10 11 duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 12 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 13 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 14 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 15 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 16 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 17 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, and commissions; and prescribing the manner in which the 18 19 number and compensation of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and 20 21 commissions shall be determined, " implementing the addition 22 of section 4.1 to Article IV of the Constitution of 23 Pennsylvania; establishing the Office of Attorney General 24 elected by the citizens and setting forth powers and duties 25 of the Attorney General; creating an Office of General 26 Counsel and providing for legal services for Commonwealth 27 agencies; transferring, reorganizing or reconstituting 28 certain boards, commissions and agencies; placing certain 29 duties upon the courts and district attorneys; repealing certain acts and parts of acts and making appropriations," 30 31 imposing additional limitations on consent decrees.

- 2 Section 1. Sections 204(e) and 301(12) of the act of October
- 3 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys
- 4 Act, are amended to read:
- 5 Section 204. Legal advice and civil matters.
- 6 * * *
- 7 (e) Limitations in civil litigations.--The Attorney General
- 8 shall not agree to the entry of a consent decree in any action
- 9 against the Commonwealth or any agency which includes either the
- 10 enactment of specific legislation or the appropriation or
- 11 <u>expenditure of Commonwealth funds in excess of \$100,000</u> without
- 12 the approval of the Governor and without both notice to the
- 13 General Assembly through the offices of the Secretary of the
- 14 Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives and
- 15 approval of the General Assembly by concurrent resolution.

- 17 Section 301. General Counsel.
- 18 There is hereby established the Office of General Counsel
- 19 which shall be headed by a General Counsel appointed by the
- 20 Governor to serve at his pleasure who shall be the legal advisor
- 21 to the Governor and who shall:

- 23 (12) Not agree to the entry of a consent decree in any

- Section 2. This act shall apply to all civil litigation 2
- 3 commenced on or after the effective date of this act.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 4
