## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the offenses of terrorism, soliciting or providing support for an act of terrorism and hindering prosecution for an act of terrorism and for penalties.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
9	Anti-Terrorism Act.
10	Section 2. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
11	Statutes is amended by adding sections to read:
12	<u>§ 2717. Terrorism.</u>
13	(a) OffenseA person commits the offense of terrorism if,
14	with the intent to intimidate or coerce a civilian population,
15	influence the policy of a government by intimidation or
16	coercion, or affect the conduct of a government by mass
17	destruction, assassination or kidnapping, he commits a specified

1 offense under this part that involves a violent act or an act dangerous to human life, including an attempt or conspiracy to 2 3 commit any such offense. 4 (b) Grading and penalty.--If the specified offense is a 5 misdemeanor or a felony of the third or second degree, an offense under this section shall be classified one degree higher 6 in the classification specified in section 106 (relating to 7 8 classes of offenses) than the classification of the specified 9 offense. If the specified offense is a felony of the first degree, a person convicted of an offense under this section 10 11 shall be sentenced to a term of imprisonment fixed by the court at not more than 40 years and may be sentenced to pay a fine of 12 13 not more than \$50,000. If the specified offense resulted in the death of a person other than one of the participants, sentencing 14 15 shall be in accordance with 42 Pa.C.S. § 9711 (relating to 16 sentencing procedure for murder of the first degree). (c) Application of section. -- This section shall not apply to 17 18 conduct by a party to a labor dispute as defined in the act of June 2, 1937 (P.L.1198, No.308), known as the Labor Anti-19 20 Injunction Act, or to any constitutionally protected activity. (d) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following 21 22 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 23 subsection: 24 "Dangerous to human life." An act which is intended to or 25 likely to cause death or serious bodily injury. "Mass destruction." An act which is intended to or likely to 26 27 destroy or cause serious damage to another person or persons, 28 transportation-related infrastructure or facilities, energyrelated infrastructure or facilities, public or private 29 buildings, places of public accommodation or public works by 30

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1	explosion, fire, flood, avalanche, collapse and release of
2	poison gas, radioactive material or other harmful substance or
3	by any other means causing potential widespread death, injury or
4	damage.
5	§ 2718. Soliciting or providing support for terrorism and
6	terrorist organizations.
7	(a) OffenseA person commits the offense of soliciting or
8	providing support for terrorism or a terrorist organization
9	when, with the intent that the material support or resources
10	will be used, in whole or in part, to plan, prepare, carry out
11	or aid in terrorism or the concealment of, or an escape from,
12	terrorism, he raises, solicits, collects or provides material
13	support or resources.
14	(b) GradingNotwithstanding the provisions of section
15	<u>2717(b) (relating to terrorism), if the total value of material</u>
16	support or resources exceeds \$1,000, an offense under this
17	section is a felony of the second degree; otherwise, an offense
18	under this section is a felony of the third degree.
19	(c) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
20	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
21	subsection:
22	"Material support or resources." Currency or other financial
23	securities, financial services, lodging, training, safe houses,
24	false documentation or identification, communications equipment,
25	facilities, weapons, lethal substances, explosives, personnel,
26	transportation and other physical assets, except medicine or
27	religious materials.
28	"Terrorism." An act classified as an offense under section
29	<u>2717(a) (relating to terrorism).</u>
30	"Terrorist organization." The term includes any

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1	organization, domestic or foreign, which directly engages in the
2	planning, preparation, carrying out or aiding of any act of
3	terrorism and includes, but is not limited to, any organization
4	under section 219 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (66
5	<u>Stat. 163, 8 U.S.C. § 1189) as a foreign terrorist organization.</u>
6	§ 2719. Hindering prosecution for terrorism.
7	(a) OffenseA person commits the offense of hindering
8	prosecution for terrorism if he renders criminal assistance to a
9	person who has committed terrorism, knowing or believing that
10	such person engaged in conduct constituting terrorism.
11	(b) GradingNotwithstanding the provisions of section
12	2717(b) (relating to terrorism), if the terrorism resulted in
13	the death of a person other than one of the participants, an
14	offense under this section is a felony of the second degree;
15	otherwise, an offense under this section is a felony of the
16	third degree.
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1	(3) provides such person with money, transportation,
2	weapon, disguise or other means of avoiding discovery or
3	apprehension;
4	(4) prevents or obstructs, by means of force,
5	intimidation or deception, anyone from performing an act
6	which might aid in the discovery or apprehension of such
7	person or in the bringing of a criminal charge against him;
8	or
9	(5) suppresses, by any act of concealment, alteration or
10	destruction, any physical evidence which might aid in the
11	discovery or apprehension of such person or in the bringing
12	<u>of a criminal charge against him.</u>
13	"Terrorism." An act classified as an offense under section
14	2717(a) (relating to terrorism).
15	Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
16	(1) The addition of 18 Pa.C.S. §§ 2717, 2718 and 2719
17	shall take effect in 60 days.
18	(2) Section 1 of this act and this section shall take
19	effect immediately.
