Amending the act of March 20, 2003 (P.L. , No.1A), entitled "An act to provide from the General Fund for the expenses of 2 3 the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 7 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003; to provide appropriations from the 9 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 10 Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores 11 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust 12 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the 13 14 Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology 15 Development Authority Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 16 the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the 17 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 18 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 19 2004; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 20 for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for the proper operation of the several departments of the 21 22 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 23 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 24 25 the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted
