## AN ACT

To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the 2 Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for certain institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 6 7 ending June 30, 2003; to provide appropriations from the State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores 9 10 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust 11 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the 12 Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology 13 14 Development Authority Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 15 the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the 16 Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 17 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 18 2004; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 19 for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for the 20 proper operation of the several departments of the 21 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 22 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the 23 appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted 24 receipt accounts for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 25

- the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003; and making
- 3 a repeal.
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- 19 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 20 hereby enacts as follows:
- 21 PART I
- 22 GENERAL PROVISIONS
- 23 Section 101. Short title.--This act shall be known and may
- 24 be cited as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 2003.
- 25 Section 102. Definitions.--The following words and phrases
- 26 when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in
- 27 this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 28 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau
- 29 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 30 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,

- 2 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 3 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 4 other assistants in any department, board or commission.
- 5 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 6 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 7 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 8 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage, telephones and
- 9 telegraph rentals and toll charges, newspaper advertising and
- 10 notices, public advertising by or through any medium, fuel,
- 11 light, heat, power and water, minor construction and renovation,
- 12 repairs or reconstruction of equipment, buildings and
- 13 facilities, rent of real estate and equipment, premiums on
- 14 workers' compensation, insurance premiums on policies of
- 15 liability insurance, insurance premiums on medical payment
- 16 insurance and surety bonds for volunteer workers, premiums on
- 17 employee group life insurance and employee and retired employee
- 18 group hospital and medical insurance, payment of Commonwealth
- 19 share of Social Security taxes and unemployment compensation
- 20 costs for State employees, the purchase of replacement or
- 21 additional equipment and machinery and all other incidental
- 22 costs and expenses, including payment to the Department of
- 23 General Services of mileage and other charges for the use of
- 24 automobiles and rental payments for permanently assigned
- 25 automobiles and of expenses or costs of services incurred
- 26 through the Purchasing Fund. The term "expenses" also shall
- 27 include the medical costs for the treatment of inmates of State
- 28 institutions when the inmate must be transferred to an outside
- 29 hospital: Provided, That in no case shall the State institution
- 30 pay more for patient care than that provided under the State

- 16 (f) The State Stores Fund. -- The following sums set forth in

- 20 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other

- 22 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 23 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 24 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 25 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 26 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 27 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 28 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

- 6 contractual services and other expenses necessary for the proper
- 7 conduct of the duties, functions and activities for the purposes
- 8 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 9 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 10 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.
- 11 (h) Aviation Restricted Revenue Account. -- The following
- 12 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 13 appropriated from the Aviation Restricted Revenue Account in the
- 14 Motor License Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the
- 15 Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the
- 16 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and for the payment of bills
- 17 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year
- 18 ending June 30, 2003.
- 19 (i) Hazardous Material Response Fund. -- The following sums
- 20 set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,
- 21 are hereby specifically appropriated from the Hazardous Material
- 22 Response Fund to the several hereinafter named agencies of the
- 23 Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of fees
- 24 for contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 25 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 26 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 27 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 28 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 29 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 30 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.

- 1 (j) Milk Marketing Fund.--The following sums set forth in

- 4 several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department
- 5 of the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 6 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 7 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 8 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 9 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 10 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 11 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes

- 23 purchase or rental of goods and services and for the payment of
- 24 any other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary

- 6 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 7 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 8 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 9 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 10 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 11 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

- 19 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 20 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 21 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 22 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 23 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 24 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 25 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 26 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

- 28 (p) Tobacco Settlement Fund. -- The following sums set forth
- 29 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 30 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to

- 1 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of
- 2 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 3 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 4 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 5 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 6 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
- 7 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 8 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 9 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 10 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 11 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.
- 12 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations.--The
- 13 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this
- 14 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 15 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to
- 16 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive
- 17 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses
- 18 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for
- 19 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and for the payment of
- 20 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal
- 21 year ending June 30, 2003. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 22 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal
- 23 year.
- 24 Section 106. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The
- 25 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 26 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
- 27 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 28 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
- 29 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are
- 30 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003.

- 1 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small
- 2 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 3 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 4 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 5 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet
- 6 community development needs.
- 7 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services
- 8 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 9 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on
- 10 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 11 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 12 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 13 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 14 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 15 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 16 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
- 17 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 18 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 19 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 20 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
- 21 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
- 22 violence services.
- 23 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The
- 24 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 25 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 26 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
- 27 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 28 special health care needs, and in providing health services for
- 29 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
- 30 care.

- 1 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-
- 2 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
- 3 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income
- 4 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
- 5 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds
- 6 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds
- 7 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
- 8 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement. Unexpended
- 9 weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being
- 10 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services
- 11 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the
- 12 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall
- 13 notify the chairman and the minority chairman of the
- 14 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and the
- 15 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House
- 16 of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such funds
- 17 ten days prior to any reallocation.
- 18 (q) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
- 19 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
- 20 persons.
- 21 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
- 22 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
- 23 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
- 24 serious emotional disturbance.
- 25 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block
- 26 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs
- 27 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.
- 28 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child
- 29 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the
- 30 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and

availability of child care for low-income families. 1 2 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant. --3 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG) 4 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care, training and support services, child welfare and administration 5 for eligible families and individuals. 6 7 PART II GENERAL FUND AND FEDERAL APPROPRIATIONS 8 9 FOR 2003-2004 10 SUBPART A 11 EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT 12 Section 201. - 14 Section 2002. Compliance with other law before funds
- 15 available. -- No appropriation made by this act to any department,
- 16 board, commission or agency of the Executive Department shall be
- 17 available unless and until the department, board, commission or
- 18 agency has complied with sections 615 and 616 of the act of
- 19 April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative
- 20 Code of 1929.
- 21 Section 2003. Contracts prerequisite to encumbering or
- 22 committing funds. -- Funds available to agencies, boards,
- 23 departments, commissions, or other governmental entities under
- 24 this act for the procurement of supplies, services or
- 25 construction shall not be available for payment of, or to be
- 26 committed to or encumbered for payment of, any such procurement
- 27 unless and until the agency, board, department or other
- 28 governmental entity has complied with all of the requirements
- 29 applicable to the procurement that are set out in 62 Pa.C.S.
- 30 (relating to procurement) and in the policies, procedures and

- 1 regulations instituted in accordance with that code.
- 2 Section 2004. Minority business set-asides.--(a) Each
- 3 department or other instrumentality of the Commonwealth listed
- 4 in Subpart A of Part II authorized to contract for buildings,
- 5 highways, commodities, equipment, supplies or services shall
- 6 report to the General Assembly all information pertinent to
- 7 anticipated procurement needs at the beginning of each fiscal
- 8 year and each fiscal quarter thereafter.
- 9 (b) As used in this section, the term "minority business"
- 10 means a minority business enterprise as defined in the act of
- 11 July 22, 1974 (P.L.598, No.206), known as the Pennsylvania
- 12 Minority Business Development Authority Act.
- 13 Section 2005. Appropriation of funds from miscellaneous
- 14 sources.--(a) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this
- 15 act, moneys received in payment for food and household supplies
- 16 furnished to employees and other persons, except inmates, by an
- 17 institution, and moneys received from the proceeds from the sale
- 18 of any products of the soil, meats, livestock, timber or other
- 19 materials sold by the department shall be paid into the General
- 20 Fund and are hereby appropriated out of the General Fund to the
- 21 several respective institutions for the operation and
- 22 maintenance of the institutions.
- 23 (b) In addition to the amounts appropriated by this act, all
- 24 moneys received from any other source, except the Federal
- 25 Government, as contributions for the programs provided herein or
- 26 as payment for services or materials furnished by one
- 27 institution to another, except those collections designated as
- 28 revenues, shall be paid into the General Fund and are hereby
- 29 appropriated out of the General Fund for the purposes of the
- 30 respective appropriations.

- 1 (c) In addition to any funds specifically appropriated by
- 2 this act, all moneys received by a department or agency of the
- 3 Commonwealth from any other sources, except the Federal
- 4 Government, as contributions or supplements to the department or
- 5 agency for a program or administration of an act included in
- 6 this act shall be paid into the General Fund and credited to the
- 7 appropriation for that program or administration of the act.
- 8 Section 2006. Lapsing of unused funds.--(a) Except as
- 9 otherwise provided by law or by this section, that part of all
- 10 appropriations in Parts II, III, IV, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X,
- 11 XI, XII, XIII, XIV, XV and XVI unexpended, uncommitted or
- 12 unencumbered as of June 30, 2004, shall automatically lapse as
- 13 of that date.
- 14 (b) The appropriation in section 208 for fruit tree
- 15 indemnity payments shall be a continuing appropriation.
- 16 (c) The appropriations in Part II to the Legislative
- 17 Department shall be continuing appropriations.
- 18 Section 2007. Appellate courts appropriation contingency. --
- 19 The funds appropriated in Part II to the Supreme, Superior and
- 20 Commonwealth Courts for justice and judge expenses are
- 21 contingent upon a vouchered expense account plan being continued
- 22 by the Supreme Court.
- 23 Section 2008. Transfer of excess funds.--The Governor may
- 24 transfer any excess money in those funds receiving proceeds of
- 25 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania general obligation bonds in excess
- 26 of the amount necessary for the purposes for which the bonds
- 27 were issued to the appropriate sinking fund for payment of debt
- 28 service due on outstanding bonds. If such excess funds, together
- 29 with any available balance, exceed the amount of debt service
- 30 remaining to be paid, the funds shall be transferred to the

- 1 General Fund or to the appropriate special fund responsible for
- 2 such debt service.
- 3 Section 2009. Transfer of funds by the Supreme Court.--(a)
- 4 The Supreme Court may transfer any excess funds appropriated in
- 5 sections 281, 285, 286, 287 and 291 to the Judicial Department
- 6 in Part II to the Judicial Computer Augmentation Account during
- 7 the month of June 2004. No transfer may create or increase a
- 8 deficiency in the appropriation from which the transfer is made.
- 9 Whenever the Supreme Court makes a transfer under this
- 10 subsection, the Supreme Court shall give written notification to
- 11 the Secretary of the Budget and chairman and minority chairman
- 12 of the Senate Committee on Appropriations and the chairman and
- 13 the minority chairman of the House of Representatives Committee
- 14 on Appropriations ten days prior to any transfer which shall
- 15 also include certification that such transfer will not result in
- 16 a deficit in any appropriation.
- 17 (b) The Supreme Court may transfer funds appropriated in
- 18 section 281 between the line items in that section provided that
- 19 no transfer may create or increase a deficiency in the
- 20 appropriation from which the transfer is made. Whenever the
- 21 Supreme Court makes a transfer under this subsection, the
- 22 Supreme Court shall give written notification to the Secretary
- 23 of the Budget and the chairman and minority chairman of the
- 24 Senate Committee on Appropriations and the chairman and the
- 25 minority chairman of the House of Representatives Committee on
- 26 Appropriations ten days prior to any transfer which shall also
- 27 include certification that such transfer will not result in a
- 28 deficit in any appropriation.
- 29 Section 2010. Deduction of expended appropriations under
- 30 prior law.--Any money which has been appropriated and expended

- 1 under the act of March 20, 2003 (P.L. , No.1A), known as the
- 2 General Appropriation Act of 2003, prior to its repeal, shall be
- 3 deducted from the corresponding appropriation in this act.
- 4 Section 2011. Transfer from Agriculture Farm Operations
- 5 Account. -- The sum of \$1,000,000 is transferred from the
- 6 Agriculture Farm Operations Account to the State Farm Show
- 7 Products Fund.
- 8 Section 2012. Repeal.--(a) Except as set forth in
- 9 subsection (b), the act of March 20, 2003 (P.L. , No.1A),
- 10 known as the General Appropriation Act of 2003, is repealed.
- 11 (b) Part XVIII and section 2010 of the General Appropriation
- 12 Act of 2003 are saved from repeal.

- 15 Section 2101. Effective date. -- This act shall take effect
- 16 immediately.
