To provide from the General Fund for the expenses of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the 2 3 Commonwealth, the public debt and for the public schools for 4 the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for certain 5 institutions and organizations, and for the payment of bills 6 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003; to provide appropriations from the 7 8 State Lottery Fund, the Energy Conservation and Assistance 9 Fund, the Hazardous Material Response Fund, The State Stores 10 Fund, the Milk Marketing Fund, the Home Investment Trust 11 Fund, the Emergency Medical Services Operating Fund, the Tuition Payment Fund, the Banking Department Fund, the 12 13 Firearm Records Check Fund, the Ben Franklin Technology Development Authority Fund and the Tobacco Settlement Fund to 14 15 the Executive Department; to provide appropriations from the Judicial Computer System Augmentation Account to the Judicial 16 17 Department for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 18 2004; to provide appropriations from the Motor License Fund 19 for the fiscal year July 1, 2003, to June 30, 2004, for the 20 proper operation of the several departments of the 21 Commonwealth and the Pennsylvania State Police authorized to 22 spend Motor License Fund moneys; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds to the Executive Department of 23 the Commonwealth and for the establishment of restricted 24

- 14 Section 101. Short title. This act shall be known and may
- 15 be cited as the Supplemental General Appropriation Act of 2003.
- 16 Section 102. Definitions. The following words and phrases

- 8 hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of the
- 9 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 10 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 11 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 12 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 13 goods and services and for the payment of any other expenses, as
- 14 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 15 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 16 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 17 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid

- 19 (p) Tobacco Settlement Fund. The following sums set forth
- 20 in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 21 specifically appropriated from the Tobacco Settlement Fund to
- 22 the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department of
- 23 the Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other
- 24 compensation and travel expenses of the duly appointed officers
- 25 and employees of the Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for
- 26 contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
- 27 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
- 28 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct
- 29 of the duties, functions and activities and for the purposes
- 30 hereinafter set forth for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

- 1 2003, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 2 at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003.
- 3 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. The
- 4 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this
- 5 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby
- 6 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to
- 7 the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive
- 8 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses
- 9 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for
- 10 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and for the payment of
- 11 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal
- 12 year ending June 30, 2003. Unless otherwise stated, the
- 13 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal
- 14 <del>year.</del>
- 15 Section 106. Block grants. (a) Appropriation. The
- 16 following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 17 be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the
- 18 block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
- 19 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
- 20 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are
- 21 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003.
- 22 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant. The Small
- 23 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small
- 24 cities and communities that have a high concentration of
- 25 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their
- 26 low income and moderate income housing opportunities and to meet
- 27 community development needs.
- 28 (c) Community Services Block Grant. The Community Services
- 29 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and
- 30 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on

- 1 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the
- 2 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In
- 3 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old
- 4 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements
- 5 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to
- 6 assure proper consideration of each recipient.
- 7 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant. The
- 8 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
- 9 for the provision of preventive health and other health services
- 10 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
- 11 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
- 12 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
- 13 <del>violence services.</del>
- 14 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant. The
- 15 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to
- 16 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in
- 17 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for
- 18 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with
- 19 special health care needs, and in providing health services for
- 20 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health
- 21 <del>care.</del>
- 22 (f) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. The Low-
- 23 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help
- 24 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low income
- 25 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for
- 26 low income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds
- 27 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds
- 28 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds
- 29 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement. Unexpended
- 30 weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being

- 1 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services
- 2 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the
- 3 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall
- 4 notify the chairman and the minority chairman of the
- 5 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and the
- 6 minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House
- 7 of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such funds
- 8 ten days prior to any reallocation.
- 9 (g) Social Services Block Grant. The Social Services Block
- 10 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
- 11 persons.
- 12 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant. The Mental Health
- 13 Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
