AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for the regulation of manufactured housing and for the powers and duties of the Department of Community and Economic Development.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Manufactured
8	Housing Improvement Act.
9	Section 2. Legislative findings and purpose.
10	The General Assembly finds as follows:
11	(1) Manufactured housing plays a vital role in meeting
12	the housing needs of the citizens of this Commonwealth.
13	(2) The Congress of the United States amended the
14	National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety
15	Standards Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-383, 42 U.S.C. § 5401 et
16	seq.) in 2000 to provide for the establishment of practical,
17	uniform and, to the extent possible, performance-based
18	construction standards for manufactured homes.

1 (3) The 2000 amendments to the National Manufactured 2 Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 1974 seek to 3 ensure uniform and effective enforcement of Federal safety 4 standards for the installation of manufactured homes and 5 require that by 2005 each state implement an installation 6 program that meets certain requirements.

7 (4) To date, neither the General Assembly nor a
8 Commonwealth agency has enacted or implemented standards in
9 compliance with the 2000 amendments to the National
10 Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of
11 1974.

12 (5) It is the intent of the General Assembly and the13 purpose of this act:

14 (i) To eliminate unnecessary duplication of effort
15 by Commonwealth agencies as it relates to the
16 installation and inspection of the installation of
17 manufactured housing.

18 (ii) To provide for compliance with 2000 amendments
19 to the National Manufactured Housing Construction and
20 Safety Standards Act of 1974 by assigning the
21 responsibility to the Department of Community and
22 Economic Development.

23 (iii) To require that within 270 days of the 24 effective date of this act, the Department of Community and Economic Development meet with affected parties and 25 26 publish final form regulations concerning the 27 installation of manufactured homes, the training and 28 licensing of manufactured home installers and the inspection of the installation of manufactured homes. 29 Section 3. Definitions. 30

1 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
2 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
3 context clearly indicates otherwise:

4 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic5 Development of the Commonwealth.

6 "Installation." All activities required to assure the proper
7 onsite completion of fully integrated manufactured home
8 construction, including, but not limited to:

9 (1) site preparation, installation, finishing and10 assembly of components;

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(2) support and foundations; and

12 (3) attachment, stabilization and connection of 13 plumbing, electrical and mechanical subsystems contained 14 within or attached thereto,

15 compliant with the manufacturer's approved design, that renders 16 the home in full conformance with the manufacturer's label of 17 certification and conforms to all standards required by this 18 act.

Installer." A person who contracts with the purchaser for any portion or all of the onsite completion and installation of a manufactured home under contract or connected by agency with the manufacturer, retailer or builder.

23 "Manufactured housing" or "manufactured home." A
24 manufactured home as defined under section 603 of the National
25 Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of
26 1974 (Public Law 93-383, 42 U.S.C. § 5402).

27 Section 4. Application of act.

(a) General rule.--This act shall be the exclusive law
 authorizing the promulgation of regulations governing the
 installation of manufactured homes, the training and licensing

1 of manufactured home installers and the inspection of the 2 installation of manufactured homes in this Commonwealth. The 3 regulations adopted by the department implementing this 4 legislation shall supersede and preempt all other laws and 5 regulations in this regard.

6 (b) Exclusion.--This act shall not apply to manufactured
7 homes installed prior to the effective date of this act.
8 Section 5. Departmental duties.

9 (a) Invitation for comments.--The department shall invite 10 comments from entities involved in the manufactured housing 11 industry, owners of manufactured homes and third-party agencies 12 concerning the promulgation of regulations governing the 13 installation of manufactured homes, the training and licensing 14 of manufactured home installers and the inspection of the 15 installation of manufactured homes in this Commonwealth.

16 (b) Regulations.--

17 (1) Within 270 days of the effective date of this act,18 the department shall promulgate regulations governing:

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(i) The installation of manufactured homes.

20 (ii) The training and licensing of manufactured home21 installers.

(iii) The inspection of the installation ofmanufactured homes in this Commonwealth.

24 (iv) The training of those persons who inspect the25 installation of manufactured homes in this Commonwealth.

(v) The issuance of a warning, suspension,
revocation or monetary fine against persons who violate
the regulations of the department promulgated under this
act.

department, satisfy the criteria established by the National 1 2 Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act of 3 1974 (Public Law 93-383, 42 U.S.C. § 5401 et seq.). (c) Fees.--The department shall determine and approve 4 5 reasonable fees for educational programs, testing and certification of those persons licensed to install and inspect 6 the installation of manufactured homes in this Commonwealth. 7 8 Section 6. Repeal.

9 All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar as they are10 inconsistent with this act.

11 Section 7. Effective date.

12 This act shall take effect immediately.
