## HOUSE BILL No. 2875 Session of 2004

INTRODUCED BY STEIL, ARMSTRONG, RUBLEY AND SCHRODER, OCTOBER 4, 2004

REFERRED TO COMMITTEE ON LABOR RELATIONS, OCTOBER 4, 2004

## AN ACT

Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 2 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of 3 unemployment compensation to be administered by the Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly 4 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) 5 6 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to 7 keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 8 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 9 10 providing procedure and administrative details for the determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 13 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 14 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State Treasurer; and prescribing penalties, providing for a study 15 to make recommendations for redesigning the contribution rate 16 notice form and related documents. 17 18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 19 20 Section 1. Section 204.1 of the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd 21 Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment 22 Compensation Law, is amended by adding a subsection to read: 23 Section 204.1. State Unemployment Compensation Advisory Council. -- \* \* \* 24 25 (1) (1) (i) The Advisory Council shall conduct a study and

- 1 make recommendations to the department regarding redesigning the
- 2 contribution rate notice form and other related documents
- 3 provided to employers.
- 4 (ii) The Advisory Council shall solicit input from State and
- 5 <u>local business leaders representing a variety of industries,</u>
- 6 <u>including those employing fewer than ten employes.</u>
- 7 (iii) The Advisory Council shall also review notice and form
- 8 formats utilized in other states.
- 9 (2) (i) No later than January 1, 2005, the Advisory Council
- 10 shall make recommendations to the department regarding
- 11 <u>improvements that should be made to the design of the</u>
- 12 contribution rate notice and other related documents.
- 13 (ii) A copy of the recommendations shall be submitted to the
- 14 President pro tempore of the Senate and to the Speaker of the
- 15 <u>House of Representatives.</u>
- 16 (3) Within six months of receipt of the Advisory Council's
- 17 recommendations regarding the design of the contribution rate
- 18 notice form and other related documents, the department shall
- 19 implement revised forms based on the recommendations of the
- 20 Advisory Council.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
