## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the week of May 10 through 18, 2003, as "National
- 2 Tourism Week" and May 6, 2003, as "Tourism Day" in
- 3 Pennsylvania.
- 4 WHEREAS, The week of May 10 through 18, 2003, has been
- 5 selected as "National Tourism Week"; and
- 6 WHEREAS, "National Tourism Week" was established in 1983 when
- 7 the Congress of the United States passed a joint resolution
- 8 designating a week in May 1984 as "National Tourism Week" and in
- 9 a White House ceremony, the President signed a Presidential

- 1 proclamation urging citizens to observe the week with
- 2 appropriate ceremonies and activities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Tourism is Pennsylvania's second largest industry
- 4 and a major contributor to the economy of this Commonwealth,
- 5 providing in excess of \$34 billion in visitor spending, 563,440
- 6 jobs with more than \$11.5 billion payroll and \$4 billion in
- 7 Federal, State and local tax revenues; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is the fifth most visited state in the
- 9 country, accounting for 4.6% of all leisure travel and 3.9% of
- 10 all business travel; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 12 week of May 10 through 18, 2003, as "National Tourism Week" and
- 13 May 6, 2003, as "Tourism Day" in Pennsylvania.
