## A RESOLUTION

1	Amending House Rule 19(b).
2	RESOLVED, That Rule 19(b) of the Rules of the House of
3	Representatives be amended to read as follows:
4	RULE 19 (b)
5	General Appropriation Bill and Non-Preferred Bills
6	This rule shall apply to all amendments offered to the
7	General Appropriation Bill for each proposed fiscal year
8	including any amendments offered to or for supplemental
9	appropriations to prior fiscal years contained within the
10	General Appropriation Bill, and shall also apply to all
11	amendments offered to any non-preferred appropriation bill for
12	the same fiscal year.
13	Any amendment offered on the floor of the House to the
14	General Appropriation Bill that proposes to increase spending of
15	State dollars for the Commonwealth's proposed fiscal year or
16	prior fiscal years above the levels contained in the General
17	Appropriation Bill as reported from the Appropriations Committee

1 plus any aggregate if certified each year by the Appropriations 2 Committee shall not be in order and may not be considered unless 3 the same amendment contains sufficient reductions in line items 4 of that General Appropriation Bill so that the amendment offered 5 does not result in a net increase in the total proposed spending 6 contained within the General Appropriation Bill plus any

7 aggregate if certified by the Appropriations Committee.

8 Any amendment offered on the floor of the House to any non-9 preferred appropriation bill that proposes to increase spending of State dollars for the current fiscal year above the levels 10 11 contained in that non-preferred appropriation bill as reported 12 from the Appropriations Committee shall not be in order and may 13 not be considered unless the same amendment contains sufficient 14 reductions in that non-preferred appropriation bill so that the amendment offered does not result in a net increase in the total 15 16 proposed spending contained within that non-preferred 17 appropriation bill.

18 In order to be considered, amendments to the General Appropriation Bill must be submitted to the Office of the Chief 19 20 Clerk by 2:00 P.M. of the Monday of the week prior to the 21 scheduled vote of the General Appropriation Bill. The Appropriations Committee for special and proper reason and by 22 23 majority vote, may waive this deadline. Members shall be 24 notified of the scheduled vote on the General Appropriation Bill no later than 4:30 P.M. of the Wednesday preceding the above 25 26 noted Monday on which the amendments must be filed to the Bill. 27 Rule 21 of the Rules of the House, insofar as it applies to the 28 filing deadline for amendments and notice requirements for the 29 voting schedule for the General Appropriation Bill, shall not apply to this rule. Rule 21 shall, however, apply to the non-30 - 2 -20040H0617R3484

1 preferred appropriation bills.

2	If the amendment cannot be submitted in accordance with the
3	provision of the previous paragraph because it is still being
4	prepared by the Legislative Reference Bureau, the member must,
5	by 2:00 P.M. on the Monday of the week prior to the scheduled
6	vote, provide the Office of the Chief Clerk with a statement,
7	prepared by the member containing the factual content and exact
8	amounts of increases and decreases in line items which would be
9	proposed in the amendment, along with certification from the
10	Legislative Reference Bureau that the amendment was submitted to
11	the Legislative Reference Bureau prior to 2:00 P.M. on the
12	aforementioned Monday. This filing deadline does not apply to
13	amendments to any non-preferred appropriation bill.
14	Debate on any debatable question related to the General
15	Appropriation Bill shall be limited to five minutes each time a
16	member is recognized. On the bill a sponsor of an amendment
17	shall be entitled to be recognized twice, a maker of a debatable
18	motion shall be entitled to be recognized twice, any other
19	members shall be entitled to be recognized once.
20	This rule may be temporarily suspended only by two-thirds
21	vote of the members elected to the House by a roll call vote.
22	Rule 77 of the Rules of the House of Representatives, insofar as
23	it applies to the temporary suspension of the rules of the
24	House, shall not apply to this rule.

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
