## A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the 2
  - feasibility and suitability of transferring the regulatory
- authority of exotic wildlife maintained in captivity from the 3
- 4 Pennsylvania Game Commission to the Department of
- 5 Agriculture.
- WHEREAS, The definition of "exotic wildlife" in Title 34 of 6
- the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is confusing and subject
- 8 to misinterpretation; and
- WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Game Commission is currently the
- regulatory agency for exotic wildlife; and 10
- WHEREAS, The Department of Agriculture has the authority to 11
- 12 regulate the health of all animals maintained in captivity; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The citizens of this Commonwealth would greatly
- benefit from clearly defined areas of regulatory authority for 14
- 15 exotic wildlife maintained in captivity; therefore be it
- 16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- State Government Commission to study the efficacy of the 17

- 1 existing statute and regulations as well as the feasibility and
- 2 suitability of transferring the regulatory authority of exotic
- 3 wildlife maintained in captivity from the Pennsylvania Game
- 4 Commission to the Department of Agriculture; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That this study address the following:
- 6 (1) Protection of the public from dangerous animals and
- 7 disease transmission from exotic wildlife to humans.
- 8 (2) Protection of the domestic animal population from
- 9 unwanted predators, unwanted genetic interaction and disease
- 10 transmission from exotic wildlife.
- 11 (3) Protection of the indigenous wildlife population
- from unwanted predators, unwanted genetic interaction and
- 13 disease transmission from exotic wildlife.
- 14 (4) The care and keeping of exotic wildlife maintained
- in captivity.
- 16 (5) Categories of exotic wildlife which should be
- 17 regulated and by which agency. Should any species be
- 18 prohibited from being maintained in captivity?
- 19 (6) Recommendations for clarifying the relevant
- 20 definitions related to regulating exotic wildlife maintained
- 21 in captivity.
- 22 (7) Recommendations for local government involvement in
- 23 the regulation of exotic wildlife maintained in captivity.
- 24 (8) Ways the budgets of the Pennsylvania Game
- 25 Commission, the Department of Agriculture and the General
- 26 Fund would be affected by any change in the regulatory
- 27 authority for exotic wildlife maintained in captivity. What
- new costs would be associated with a transfer of authority to
- 29 the Department of Agriculture?
- 30 (9) How would the existing work force be utilized if any

- 1 change in regulatory authority is recommended? What new
- 2 personnel would be necessary, what training would be
- 3 available and at what cost?

- 5 RESOLVED, THAT THE SCOPE OF THIS STUDY BE LIMITED TO EXOTIC
- 6 WILDLIFE AND SHALL NOT INCLUDE "GAME ANIMALS" AS DEFINED IN
- 7 TITLE 34 OF THE PENNSYLVANIA CONSOLIDATED STATUTES; AND BE IT
- 8 FURTHER
- 9 RESOLVED, That the report of the Joint State Government
- 10 Commission be submitted to the House of Representatives by
- 11 December 31, 2004.
