- 2 <u>DIRECTORS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY REQUEST THAT THE DEPARTMENT</u>
- 3 OF EDUCATION PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO CREATE THE SCHOOL
- 4 IMPROVEMENT PLAN PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION 1116(C)(7) OF THE NO
- 5 CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.
- 6 (B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO
- 7 SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT MAKE REQUESTS UNDER SUBSECTION (A). SUCH
- 8 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE MAY INVOLVE ANY ASSISTANCE THAT MAY BE
- 9 SPECIFIED IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN,
- 10 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO:
- 11 (1) ANALYSIS OF DATA FROM THE PENNSYLVANIA SYSTEM OF SCHOOL
- 12 ASSESSMENT TEST OR ANY OTHER TEST ESTABLISHED BY THE STATE BOARD
- 13 OF EDUCATION TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 2603-
- 14 B(D)(10)(I).
- 15 (2) IDENTIFICATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PROFESSIONAL
- 16 DEVELOPMENT AND INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES AND METHODS TO ADDRESS
- 17 SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONAL ISSUES THAT CAUSED THE SCHOOL TO BE
- 18 IDENTIFIED.
- 19 (3) ANALYSIS OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S BUDGET OR PARTS
- 20 THEREOF TO ENABLE THE SCHOOL TO MORE EFFECTIVELY ALLOCATE ITS
- 21 RESOURCES.
- 22 (C) IN ORDER TO FULFILL ITS DUTIES UNDER THIS SECTION, THE
- 23 <u>DEPARTMENT MAY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, ASSIGN</u>
- 24 PERSONNEL OR CONTRACT WITH OUTSIDE PROVIDERS TO ENSURE THAT THE
- 25 REQUIREMENTS OF SUBSECTION (B) ARE MET. THE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE
- 26 PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE MADE
- 27 READILY AVAILABLE TO ENSURE THAT THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE
- 28 IMPROVEMENT PLAN IS COMPLETED WITHIN 90 DAYS OF THE SCHOOL
- 29 <u>DISTRICT'S IDENTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 1116(C)(3) OF THE NO</u>
- 30 CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.

- 1 SECTION 2. SECTION 914-A OF THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A
- 2 CLAUSE TO READ:
- 3 Section 914-A. Powers and Duties of the Intermediate Unit
- 4 Board of Directors. -- An intermediate unit board of directors
- 5 shall have the power and its duty shall be:
- 6 * * *
- 7 (18) To appoint academic improvement teams and coordinate
- 8 <u>and administer (18) TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS</u>
- 9 ELIGIBLE FOR ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE AND COORDINATE the academic
- 10 improvement program established under section 925-A.
- 11 Section $\frac{2}{3}$. The act is amended by adding a section to read: <---

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- 12 Section 925-A. Academic Improvement Program. -- (a) Each
- 13 <u>intermediate unit shall coordinate and administer PROVIDE</u>
- 14 SUPPORT TO AND COORDINATE an academic improvement program for
- 15 any school district assigned to the intermediate unit that is
- 16 <u>eliqible for ACADEMIC assistance under subsection (b). The</u>
- 17 intermediate unit shall provide technical support and staff
- 18 assistance to an academic improvement team appointed under
- 19 subsection (c).
- 20 (b) A school district shall be eliqible for academic
- 21 <u>assistance under this section where:</u>
- 22 (1) Any school in the school district has a percentage of <-
- 23 its students in any grade level subject to the Pennsylvania
- 24 System of School Assessment or any other test established by the
- 25 State Board of Education to meet the requirements of section
- 26 2603 B(d)(10) that score below the yearly proficiency target
- 27 established by the Department of Education to calculate adequate
- 28 yearly progress under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001
- 29 (Public Law 107 110, 115 Stat. 1425).
- 30 <u>(2) Any school in the school district is identified for</u>

- 1 improvement or corrective action under section 1116(c)(3) or
- 2 (10) of the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001.
- 3 (3) The school district requests academic assistance under
- 4 (1) ANY SCHOOL IN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT HAS NOT MET THE YEARLY <---
- 5 TARGET PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION PURSUANT TO
- 6 STANDARDS APPROVED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO MEET THE
- 7 REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 2603-B(D)(10)(I) FOR USE IN MEASURING
- 8 PROGRESS TOWARD ADEQUATE YEARLY PROGRESS UNDER THE NO CHILD LEFT
- 9 <u>BEHIND ACT OF 2001 (PUBLIC LAW 107-110, 115 STAT. 1425); OR</u>
- 10 (2) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUESTS ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE UNDER
- 11 this section.
- 12 (c) (1) Within thirty (30) days of the intermediate unit's
- 13 receipt of the list of school districts eligible FOR ACADEMIC
- 14 ASSISTANCE under subsection (b), an academic improvement team
- 15 <u>shall be appointed for each eligible school district. Members of</u>
- 16 the academic improvement team shall be appointed by the
- 17 intermediate unit board of directors and the board of school
- 18 directors of the school district eligible for academic
- 19 assistance.
- 20 (2) Five (5) members of the academic improvement team shall
- 21 be appointed by the intermediate unit board of directors. Such
- 22 members shall not be employed by or otherwise affiliated with
- 23 the school district eligible for academic assistance and may
- 24 include:
- 25 (i) Intermediate unit staff members.
- 26 (ii) Teachers EMPLOYED BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS ASSIGNED TO THE
- 27 INTERMEDIATE UNIT.
- 28 (iii) Administrators EMPLOYED BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS ASSIGNED
- 29 <u>TO THE INTERMEDIATE UNIT.</u>
- 30 (iv) School board members FROM SCHOOL DISTRICTS ASSIGNED TO

- 1 THE INTERMEDIATE UNIT.
- 2 (v) Faculty members of colleges or universities in this
- 3 <u>Commonwealth with particular expertise in school improvement.</u>
- 4 (3) Four (4) members of the academic improvement team shall
- 5 be appointed by the board of school directors of the school
- 6 <u>district eligible for academic assistance. Such members shall</u>
- 7 include:
- 8 (i) A parent of a student enrolled in the school district.
- 9 (ii) A teacher employed by the school district.
- 10 (iii) An administrator employed by the school district.
- 11 (iv) A member of the board of school directors of the school
- 12 <u>district</u>.
- 13 (4) The intermediate unit board of directors shall select a
- 14 <u>chairman of the academic improvement team from the members</u>
- 15 <u>appointed under paragraph (2).</u>
- 16 (d) The academic improvement team shall have the following
- 17 powers and duties:
- 18 (1) To create DESIGN an academic improvement plan pursuant
- 19 to subsection (e). for any school in the school district that is
- 20 eligible for academic assistance under subsection (b)(1) or (2).
- 21 (2) To have ongoing access to school district personnel and
- 22 information related to the academic performance of students.
- (3) (2) To provide periodic reports on the implementation of <-
- 24 the academic improvement plan to the intermediate unit board of
- 25 directors and the board of school directors of the school
- 26 district eligible for academic assistance.
- 27 (4) To meet not less than once each month to review the (3) <-
- 28 TO MEET PERIODICALLY, BUT NOT LESS THAN QUARTERLY TO REVIEW THE
- 29 <u>implementation of the academic improvement plan.</u>
- 30 (4) To seek technical assistance from the Department of <-

- 1 Education in the design and implementation of the academic
- 2 <u>improvement plan</u>.
- 3 (e) (1) Within thirty (30) days of the appointment of an
- 4 <u>academic improvement team under subsection (c), the academic</u>
- 5 <u>improvement team shall present an academic improvement plan or <---</u>
- 6 plans to the intermediate unit board of directors and the board
- 7 of school directors of the school district. for approval at a
- 8 public meeting. THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS OF THE SCHOOL
- 9 <u>DISTRICT SHALL VOTE TO APPROVE OR DISAPPROVE THE PLAN AT ITS</u>
- 10 NEXT REGULARLY SCHEDULED PUBLIC MEETING.
- 11 (2) The academic improvement plan or plans shall set forth
- 12 specific goals for improving the academic performance of
- 13 students in content areas subject to the Pennsylvania System of
- 14 School Assessment or any other test established by the State
- 15 Board of Education to meet the requirements of section 2603-
- 16 B(d)(10)(i) and shall include strategies designed to achieve
- 17 those goals. Such strategies shall include, but may not be
- 18 limited to:
- (i) The involvement of parents in the improvement of
- 20 <u>academic performance through the development of home activities</u>
- 21 <u>and materials to enhance student learning.</u>
- 22 (ii) Continuing professional education options in addition
- 23 to options included in the continuing professional education
- 24 plan required under section 1205.1(c.1). Such additional options
- 25 shall be specific to improvements in the academic performance of
- 26 students.
- 27 (iii) Classroom instructional strategies specific to
- 28 improvements in the academic performance of students.
- 29 (iv) The redesign of curricula specific to improvements in
- 30 the academic performance of students.

- 1 (v) Improvements in school safety.
- 2 (vi) Tutoring programs for students whose results on the
- 3 Pennsylvania System of School Assessment or any other test were
- 4 below the level of proficiency established by the State Board of
- 5 Education to meet the requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i).
- 6 (3) The academic improvement plan shall be effective for one <---

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- 7 (1) school year WHERE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IS ELIGIBLE FOR
- 8 ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE UNDER SUBSECTION (B). At the conclusion of
- 9 the school year and within fifteen (15) days of the school
- 10 district's notification of the results of the school district's
- 11 performance on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment or
- 12 any other test established by the State Board of Education to
- 13 meet the requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i), the academic
- 14 improvement team shall review such results and make a report to
- 15 the intermediate unit board of directors and the board of school
- 16 <u>directors of the school district eliqible for academic</u>
- 17 assistance.
- 18 (4) Where the ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT TEAM DETERMINES THAT THE
- 19 <u>school district continues to be eliqible for academic assistance</u>
- 20 under subsection (b), the academic improvement team shall
- 21 propose any necessary adjustments to the academic improvement
- 22 plan or plans to the intermediate unit board of directors and
- 23 the board of school directors of the school district eligible
- 24 for academic assistance. Such adjustments shall be subject to
- 25 the approval of the intermediate unit board of directors and the <-
- 26 board of school directors and shall constitute a new academic
- 27 improvement plan.
- 28 (5) Where the ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT TEAM DETERMINES THAT THE <-
- 29 school district is no longer eligible for academic assistance
- 30 under subsection (b), the academic improvement team shall

- 1 recommend the termination of the academic improvement plan.
- 2 Termination of the academic improvement plan shall be subject to
- 3 the approval of the board of school directors of the school
- 4 district eligible for academic assistance. IMPROVEMENT TEAM
- 5 SHALL TERMINATE. THE BOARD OF SCHOOL DIRECTORS OF THE SCHOOL
- 6 DISTRICT ELIGIBLE FOR ACADEMIC ASSISTANCE MAY CONTINUE TO
- 7 IMPLEMENT THE ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT PLAN.
- 8 (6) WHERE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IS SUBSEQUENTLY IDENTIFIED FOR
- 9 FURTHER IMPROVEMENT, THE ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT TEAM SHALL
- 10 TERMINATE. A SCHOOL DISTRICT IDENTIFIED FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENT
- 11 SHALL MEAN:
- 12 (I) A SCHOOL DISTRICT CERTIFIED AS DISTRESSED UNDER SECTION
- 13 <u>691.</u>
- 14 (II) A SCHOOL DISTRICT CERTIFIED AS AN EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT
- 15 <u>DISTRICT UNDER SECTIONS 1705-B OR 1707-B.</u>
- 16 (III) A SCHOOL DISTRICT PLACED ON AN EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT
- 17 LIST UNDER SECTION 1703-B.
- 18 (IV) A SCHOOL DISTRICT IN WHICH ANY SCHOOL IS IDENTIFIED FOR
- 19 IMPROVEMENT OR CORRECTIVE ACTION UNDER SECTION 1116(C)(3) OR
- 20 (10) OF THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.
- 21 <u>(f) The Department of Education shall:</u>
- 22 (1) Annually provide each intermediate unit with a list of
- 23 school districts eligible for academic assistance under
- 24 <u>subsection (b)(i) or (ii).</u>
- 25 (2) Upon request, provide technical assistance to an
- 26 <u>academic improvement team.</u>
- 27 (3) Establish a clearinghouse of information related to
- 28 <u>strategies for improving the academic performance of students</u>
- 29 <u>under subsection (e)(2).</u>
- 30 (4) Establish and provide continuing professional education

- 1 courses, programs, activities or learning experiences under
- 2 <u>section 1205.2(f)</u> specific to the classroom strategies to
- 3 <u>improve the academic performance of students in content areas</u>
- 4 subject to the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment or any
- 5 other test established by the State Board of Education to meet
- 6 the requirements of section 2603-B(d)(10)(i).
- 7 Section 3. Section 2595 of the act is amended by adding a <-
- 8 subsection to read:
- 9 Section 2595. School Performance Incentives. * * *
- 10 (f.3) No less than fifty percent (50%) of the allocation for
- 11 school performance funding under this section shall be used by
- 12 <u>the Department of Education to establish an incentive program to</u>
- 13 <u>reward school districts eligible for academic assistance under</u>
- 14 section 925 A that show improved academic performance as
- 15 evidenced by a decline in the percentage of students scoring
- 16 <u>below the level of proficiency on the Pennsylvania System of</u>
- 17 School Assessment or any other test established by the State
- 18 Board of Education to meet the requirements of section 2603
- 19 B(d)(10)(i).
- 20 * * *
- 21 (5) DEVELOP AND PROMULGATE BY GUIDELINES, CRITERIA AND
- 22 PROCEDURES FOR PROVIDING FUNDS TO INTERMEDIATE UNITS UNDER THIS

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- 23 SECTION. APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDS SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
- 24 DEPARTMENT FOR APPROVAL. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE ASSISTANCE
- 25 TO APPLICANTS IN THE PREPARATION OF APPLICATIONS.
- 26 (G) THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 27 (1) A SCHOOL DISTRICT CERTIFIED AS DISTRESSED UNDER SECTION
- 28 <u>691.</u>
- 29 (2) A SCHOOL DISTRICT CERTIFIED AS AN EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT
- 30 <u>DISTRICT UNDER SECTIONS 1705-B OR 1707-B.</u>

- 1 (3) A SCHOOL DISTRICT PLACED ON AN EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT
- 2 <u>LIST UNDER SECTION 1703-B.</u>
- 3 (4) A SCHOOL DISTRICT IN WHICH ANY SCHOOL IS IDENTIFIED FOR
- 4 IMPROVEMENT OR CORRECTIVE ACTION UNDER SECTION 1116(C)(3) OR
- 5 (10) OF THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND ACT OF 2001.
- Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 6
