AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the responsibilities of the Pennsylvania State
- 2 Police regarding criminal history background reports for
- 3 persons participating in harness or horse racing.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Criminal history background reports.
- 7 (a) Provision. -- The Pennsylvania State Police shall, at the
- 8 request of the State Harness Racing Commission or the State
- 9 Horse Racing Commission, provide criminal history background
- 10 reports, which shall include records of criminal arrests or
- 11 convictions, on applicants for licensure by the commission
- 12 pursuant to section 213 of the act of December 17, 1981
- 13 (P.L.435, No.135), known as the Race Horse Industry Reform Act,
- 14 including, but not limited to, officers, directors and
- 15 stockholders of licensed corporations, horse owners, trainers,
- 16 jockeys, drivers and other persons participating in thoroughbred
- 17 or harness horse meetings and other persons and vendors who
- 18 exercise their occupation or employment at such meetings.

- 1 (b) Submittal of fingerprints.--The State Harness Racing
- 2 Commission and the State Horse Racing Commission shall require
- 3 applicants to submit a full set of fingerprints which shall be
- 4 forwarded by the commission to the Pennsylvania State Police for
- 5 the purpose of verifying the identity of the applicants and
- 6 facilitating the preparation of criminal history background
- 7 reports under subsection (a).
- 8 (c) Exemption. -- The State Harness Racing Commission and the
- 9 State Horse Racing Commission may exempt applicants for
- 10 positions not related to the care or training of horses, racing,
- 11 wagering, security or the management of licensed corporations
- 12 from the provisions of this act.
- 13 Section 2. Effective date.
- 14 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
