## AN ACT

Amending the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), entitled "An act establishing a fixed minimum wage and overtime rates for employes, with certain exceptions; providing for minimum rates for learners and apprentices; creating a Minimum Wage Advisory Board and defining its powers and duties; conferring powers and imposing duties upon the Department of Labor and Industry; imposing duties on employers; and providing penalties," further providing for minimum wage.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows:

Section 1. Section 4(a) and (a.1) of the act of January 17, 1968 (P.L.11, No.5), known as The Minimum Wage Act of 1968, amended or added December 15, 1988 (P.L.1232, No.150), are amended to read:

Section 4. Minimum Wages.--Except as may otherwise be

Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29 U.S.C. § 201 et seq.)
is increased above [three dollars thirty-five cents ($3.35) an
hour] the minimum wage required under this section, the minimum
wage required under this section shall be increased by the same
amounts and effective the same date as the increases under the
Fair Labor Standards Act, and the provisions of subsection (a)
are suspended to the extent they differ from those set forth
under the Fair Labor Standards Act.
    SECTION 2. THE INCREASE IN THE MINIMUM WAGE UNDER SECTION
4(A) OF THE ACT SHALL NOT APPLY TO MINORS SUBJECT TO THE ACT OF
MAY 13, 1915 (P.L.286, NO.177), KNOWN AS THE CHILD LABOR LAW,
EXCEPT THOSE MINORS DESCRIBED IN SECTION 7.2 OF THE CHILD LABOR
LAW.
    Section z 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days
