AN ACT

1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania  
2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the offense of  
3 luring a child into a motor vehicle.

4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
5 hereby enacts as follows:

6 Section 1. Section 2910 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania  
7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:

8 § 2910. Luring a child into a motor vehicle.

9 [A person who lures] Unless the circumstances reasonably  
10 indicate that the child is in need of assistance, a person who  
11 lures or attempts to lure a child into a motor vehicle without  
12 the consent, express or implied, of the child's parent or  
13 guardian[, unless the circumstances reasonably indicate that the

1 child is in need of assistance,] commits a misdemeanor of the  
2 first degree.

3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
