AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for the offense of
- 3 luring a child into a motor vehicle.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Section 2910 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 8 § 2910. Luring a child into a motor vehicle.
- 9 [A person who lures] <u>Unless the circumstances reasonably</u>
- 10 indicate that the child is in need of assistance, a person who
- 11 <u>lures or attempts to lure</u> a child into a motor vehicle without
- 12 the consent, express or implied, of the child's parent or
- 13 guardian[, unless the circumstances reasonably indicate that the

- 1 child is in need of assistance,] commits a misdemeanor of the
- 2 first degree.
- Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. 3
