contractual services rendered, for the purchase or rental of
 goods and services and for payment of any other expenses, as
 provided by law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct

8 (g) Health Care Provider Retention Account. -- The following 9 sums, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 10 appropriated from the Health Care Provider Retention Account in 11 the General Fund to the hereinafter named agencies of the Executive Department for the purposes set forth herein for the 12 13 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and for the payment of bills 14 incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year 15 ending June 30, 2005.

16 Section 105. Federal augmentation appropriations. -- The 17 following Federal augmentation appropriations set forth in this 18 act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby 19 specifically appropriated from the Federal augmentation funds to the several hereinafter named agencies of the Executive 20 21 Department of the Commonwealth for the payment of the expenses 22 of implementing and carrying out the programs stated herein for 23 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, and for the payment of 24 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal 25 year ending June 30, 2005. Unless otherwise stated, the 26 appropriations include any carryovers from the prior fiscal 27 year.

Section 106. Block grants.--(a) Appropriation.--The following sums set forth in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby specifically appropriated from the 20050H0815B0848 - 18 - block grant (BG) funds to the several hereinafter named agencies
 of the Executive Department of the Commonwealth for the
 purposes, and under the restrictions, for which the funds are
 provided for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005.

5 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small 6 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small 7 cities and communities that have a high concentration of 8 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their 9 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet 10 community development needs.

11 (c) Community Services Block Grant. -- The Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and 12 13 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on 14 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the 15 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In 16 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old 17 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements 18 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to 19 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

(d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The
Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is
for the provision of preventive health and other health services
related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,
comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health
education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic
violence services.

(e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for 20050H0815B0848 - 19 - 1 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with 2 special health care needs, and in providing health services for 3 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health 4 care.

5 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant. -- The Low-6 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help 7 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for 8 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds 9 10 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds 11 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds shall be exempt from the 15% requirement. Unexpended 12 weatherization funds which would result in LIHEABG funds being 13 14 returned to the Federal Department of Health and Human Services 15 may be spent for assistance grants at the discretion of the 16 Secretary of the Budget. The Secretary of the Budget shall notify the chairman and the minority chairman of the 17 18 Appropriations Committee of the Senate and the chairman and the minority chairman of the Appropriations Committee of the House 19 20 of Representatives of the intent to reallocate any such funds 21 ten days prior to any reallocation.

(g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block
Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible
persons.

(h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health
Services Block Grant (MHSBG) provides funds for the provision of
services to adults with serious mental illness or children with
serious emotional disturbance.

29 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block 30 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs 20050H0815B0848 - 20 - 1 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

The written notice shall also include certification that such transfer will not result in a deficit in 14 15 any appropriation. This section shall not apply to the 16 appropriation in section 291 for gun courts. 17 PART XXI 18 EFFECTIVE DATE Section 2101. Effective date. -- This act shall take effect as 19 20 follows: 21 (1) Parts XVIII and XXI shall take effect immediately. 22 (2) This section shall take effect immediately. 23 The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1, (3) 2005, or immediately, whichever is later. 24
