AN ACT

- 1 Providing for the School Leadership Recruitment Loan Forgiveness
- 2 Program for certain Commonwealth residents pursuing graduate
- 3 study for school administration.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the School
- 8 Leadership Recruitment Loan Forgiveness Program Act.
- 9 Section 2. Declarations and findings.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 11 (1) House Resolution No. 377 of 2001, adopted December
- 12 12, 2001, directed the Joint State Government Commission to
- 13 conduct a study to determine if there is a shortage of
- 14 applicants for principal and other administrative positions
- in this Commonwealth.
- 16 (2) Subsequently, House Resolution No. 461 of 2002,
- 17 adopted June 28, 2002, directed the Joint State Government

- 1 Commission to establish a task force consisting of six
- 2 members of the House of Representatives to facilitate the
- 3 study.
- 4 (3) The task force was directed to file a report with
- 5 the Education Committee of the House of Representatives
- 6 containing recommended solutions to correct problems, if any
- 7 were found to exist.
- 8 (4) The job of the school administrator has become more
- 9 complex and stressful than ever and the compensation, in some
- 10 districts, may not, in and of itself, encourage an adequate
- 11 number of individuals to accept the challenges of an
- 12 administrative position.
- 13 (5) The task force recommended that a loan forgiveness
- program be established to encourage graduate study leading to
- administrative certification and to assist school entities in
- high need of filling administrative vacancies in hiring
- 17 qualified administrators.
- 18 Section 3. Definitions.
- 19 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 20 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 21 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 "Administrator." An individual who is employed by an
- 23 eligible school entity within this Commonwealth as a district
- 24 superintendent, assistant district superintendent, elementary
- 25 principal, middle school/junior high principal, high
- 26 school/senior high principal, elementary assistant principal,
- 27 middle school/junior high assistant principal, high
- 28 school/senior high assistant principal, director/assistant
- 29 director of vocational technical education, coordinator and
- 30 supervisor.

- 1 "Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
- 2 Agency.
- 3 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 4 Commonwealth.
- 5 "Eligible school entity." A public school district,
- 6 intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school identified
- 7 by the Secretary of Education as having a need for school
- 8 leadership recruitment loan forgiveness assistance because of
- 9 difficulty in filling administrative positions.
- 10 "Program." The School Leadership Recruitment Loan
- 11 Forgiveness Program.
- 12 "Qualified applicant." An individual who meets all of the
- 13 following criteria:
- 14 (1) Is a resident of this Commonwealth.
- 15 (2) Has successfully completed an in-State department-
- approved certification program for school principal,
- 17 vocational education director, supervisor of curriculum and
- instruction certificate, supervisor of pupil personnel
- 19 certificate, supervisor of special education, supervisor of
- 20 vocational education, single area supervisor, or the
- 21 superintendent's letter of eligibility and has been issued
- 22 the appropriate administrative certificate, supervisory
- 23 certificate or letter of eligibility.
- 24 (3) Has commenced his first year of employment as a
- 25 full-time administrator on or after the effective date of
- 26 this section.
- 27 (4) Has borrowed through and has a current outstanding
- 28 balance with federally insured guaranteed Stafford or
- 29 consolidation loan programs administered by the Pennsylvania
- 30 Higher Education Assistance Agency.

- 1 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.
- 2 Section 4. School Leadership Recruitment Loan Forgiveness
- 3 Program.
- 4 There is hereby established in this Commonwealth the School
- 5 Leadership Recruitment Loan Forgiveness Program. Qualified
- 6 applicants who are selected for the program in accordance with
- 7 this act shall be eligible for payment by the agency of a
- 8 portion of the debt incurred by the applicant through the
- 9 agency-administered federally insured guaranteed Stafford or
- 10 consolidation loan programs for the education necessary to be
- 11 certified as an administrator.
- 12 Section 5. Loan forgiveness awards.
- 13 (a) Eligibility. -- The agency shall forgive a proportional
- 14 part of a person's outstanding agency-administered federally
- 15 insured student loan for each year the person is a qualified
- 16 applicant and is engaged in full-time employment as an
- 17 administrator. Each administrator shall be required to submit
- 18 documentation of continued eligibility as the agency may
- 19 require.
- 20 (b) Award amount. -- The agency shall forgive up to a maximum
- 21 of \$10,000 over a 4-year period. No more than \$2,500 shall be
- 22 forgiven in any year. Awards shall be made in accordance with
- 23 the procedures established by the agency.
- 24 Section 6. Funding.
- 25 The agency may issue loan forgiveness awards under this act
- 26 to the extent that funds are appropriated by the General
- 27 Assembly. If funds appropriated for this act are insufficient to
- 28 provide awards under section 5 (relating to loan forgiveness
- 29 awards) to all qualified applicants, awards shall be made to
- 30 qualified applicants on a pro rata basis.

- 1 Section 7. Responsibility of the secretary.
- 2 The secretary shall identify those school entities that have
- 3 a need for school leadership recruitment loan forgiveness
- 4 assistance because of difficulty in filling administrative
- 5 positions. Once identified, the secretary shall share such list
- 6 with the agency.
- 7 Section 8. Responsibility of the agency.
- 8 The agency shall administer the program and adopt such
- 9 regulations, policies, procedures and forms as are necessary to
- 10 carry out the provisions of this act.
- 11 Section 9. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect July 1, 2005, or immediately,
- 13 whichever is later.
