AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- 2 act relating to the public school system, including certain
- 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- 4 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto, providing for participation in
- 6 graduation ceremony.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1504.1. Participation in Graduation Ceremony.--(a)
- 13 The General Assembly finds the following:
- 14 (1) Each year, school districts across this Commonwealth
- 15 celebrate their students' accomplishments through graduation
- 16 ceremonies at which high school diplomas are bestowed upon

- 1 students who have completed their high school requirements.
- 2 (2) There are children with disabilities in this
- 3 Commonwealth who have finished ATTENDED four (4) years of high <-
- 4 school, but whose individualized education programs prescribe
- 5 <u>the continuation of CONTINUED EDUCATION AFTER THE FOURTH YEAR OF</u> <---
- 6 HIGH SCHOOL, WHICH MAY INCLUDE REGULAR EDUCATION, special
- 7 <u>education</u>, <u>transition</u> <u>planning</u>, <u>transition</u> <u>services</u> <u>or</u> <u>related</u>
- 8 <u>services</u>. beyond the completion of four (4) years of high
- 9 school.
- 10 (3) It is well established that the awarding of a high
- 11 school diploma to and the high school graduation of a child with
- 12 <u>a disability is tantamount to the termination of eligibility for</u>
- 13 <u>special education and related services for the student under</u>
- 14 applicable Federal law.
- 15 (4) Many children with disabilities who will continue their
- 16 public education in accordance with their individualized
- 17 <u>education programs after finishing four (4) years of high school</u> <
- 18 ATTENDING HIGH SCHOOL FOR FOUR (4) YEARS wish to celebrate their
- 19 accomplishments by participating in a graduation ceremony with
- 20 <u>their classmates</u>.
- 21 (5) The opportunity for classmates with disabilities and
- 22 those without disabilities to celebrate their accomplishments
- 23 together only occurs once, and the opportunity to celebrate the
- 24 receipt of a diploma several years after one's classmates have
- 25 graduated diminishes the experience for students whose age peers
- 26 <u>have left high school several years earlier.</u>
- 27 (b) Beginning BY March 1, 2006, each school district that
- 28 operates a high school must have a policy and procedures that
- 29 allow a child with a disability who will have completed four (4) <
- 30 years of high school at the end of a school year to participate

- 1 in the graduation ceremony of the student's high school
- 2 graduating class and receive a certificate of completion if the
- 3 student's individualized education program prescribes only
- 4 special education, transition planning, transition services or
- 5 <u>related services beyond the student's four (4) years of high</u>
- 6 school. The policy and procedures must require timely and
- 7 meaningful written notice to children with disabilities and
- 8 their parents or quardians about the school district's policy
- 9 and procedures adopted in accordance with this section. ALLOW A
- 10 STUDENT WITH A DISABILITY WHO SATISFACTORILY COMPLETES A SPECIAL
- 11 EDUCATION PROGRAM DEVELOPED BY AN INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION
- 12 PROGRAM (IEP) TEAM OR OTHERWISE MEETS REQUIREMENTS OF 22 PA.
- 13 CODE CH. 4 (RELATING TO ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND ASSESSMENT), BUT
- 14 WHOSE IEP PRESCRIBES CONTINUED EDUCATION AFTER THE FOURTH YEAR
- 15 OF HIGH SCHOOL TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GRADUATION CEREMONY OF THE
- 16 STUDENT'S HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATING CLASS AND RECEIVE A CERTIFICATE
- 17 OF ATTENDANCE. CONTINUED EDUCATION INCLUDES REGULAR EDUCATION,
- 18 SPECIAL EDUCATION, TRANSITION PLANNING, TRANSITION SERVICES OR
- 19 RELATED SERVICES. POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ADOPTED PURSUANT TO
- 20 THIS SECTION SHALL:
- 21 (1) BE EFFECTIVE IN TIME TO ALLOW PARTICIPATION IN
- 22 GRADUATION CEREMONIES AT THE END OF THE 2005-2006 SCHOOL YEAR;
- 23 AND
- 24 (2) REQUIRE TIMELY AND MEANINGFUL WRITTEN NOTICE TO STUDENTS
- 25 WITH DISABILITIES AND THEIR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.
- 26 (C) NOTHING IN THIS ACT SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PRECLUDE
- 27 RECEIPT OF A DIPLOMA AT A LATER DATE IF THE STUDENT WITH A
- 28 DISABILITY SATISFACTORILY COMPLETES A SPECIAL EDUCATION PROGRAM
- 29 <u>DEVELOPED BY AN INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PROGRAM (IEP) TEAM OR</u>
- 30 WHO OTHERWISE MEETS REOUIREMENTS OF 22 PA. CODE CH. 4.

- (c) (D) The Department of Education shall monitor and 1
- 2 <u>enforce compliance with the provisions of this section and is</u>

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- 3 <u>authorized to adopt rules for that purpose.</u>
- Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 4
