AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736, No.338), entitled, as reenacted and amended, "An act defining the liability of an employer to pay damages for injuries received by an employe in the course of employment; establishing an elective schedule of compensation; providing procedure for the determination of liability and compensation thereunder; and prescribing penalties," further defining "employe."

- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 601(a) of the act of June 2, 1915
- 11 (P.L.736, No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act,
- 12 reenacted and amended June 21, 1939 (P.L.520, No.281), is
- 13 amended by adding a clause to read:
- 14 Section 601. (a) In addition to those persons included
- 15 within the definition of the word "employe" as defined in
- 16 section 104, "employe" shall also include:

- 1 (11) Members of community emergency response teams who are
- 2 <u>certified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency.</u>
- 3 (11) CITIZENS WHO:
- 4 (I) HAVE COMPLETED THE COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM
- 5 PROGRAM AS OUTLINED BY THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY;
- 6 (II) ARE AUTHORIZED IN WRITING BY A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY
- 7 TO ASSIST FIRST RESPONDERS IN DISASTER ASSISTANCE; AND
- 8 (III) ARE ACTING VOLUNTARILY IN THE CAPACITY OF ASSISTING
- 9 FIRST RESPONDERS IN DISASTER ASSISTANCE.
- 10 CITIZENS WHO QUALIFY UNDER THIS CLAUSE ARE CONSIDERED EMPLOYES
- 11 OF THE COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY WHICH ISSUES THE WRITTEN
- 12 <u>AUTHORIZATION UNDER SUBCLAUSE (II).</u>

- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
