AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, further providing for special registration plates and parking placards for persons with disabilities.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
hereby enacts as follows:
Section 1. Section 1338 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
[§ 1338. Person with disability plate and placard.
(a) Person with disability plate.--On the application of any person who:
(1) is blind;
(2) does not have full use of an arm or both arms;
(3) cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest;
(4) cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair or other assistive device;
(5) is restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one
second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter or the arterial oxygen tension is less than $60 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{hg}$ on room air at rest;
(6) uses portable oxygen;
(7) has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV according to the standards set by the American Heart Association;
(8) is severely limited in his or her ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition; or
(9) is a person in loco parentis of a person specified in paragraph (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7) or (8); the department shall issue a special registration plate for one passenger car or truck with a registered gross weight of not more than 9,000 pounds, designating the vehicle so licensed as being used by a person with a disability. Special plates for persons with disabilities may also be issued for vehicles operated exclusively for the use and benefit of persons with disabilities. In the case of a motorcycle, the department shall issue a decal containing the international symbol for access for persons with disabilities for display on the registration plate.
(b) Person with disability parking placard.--On the initial application or renewal application of any person who meets the qualifications of subsection (a), the department shall issue one special parking placard of such size and design as the department shall specify, designating the vehicle in which it is displayed as being used for the transportation of persons with disabilities. When parking the designated vehicle, the person with disability parking placard shall be prominently displayed in such a manner that it may be viewed from the front and rear
of the vehicle by hanging it from the front windshield rearview mirror of a vehicle only when that vehicle is utilizing a parking space reserved for persons with disabilities. When there is no rearview mirror, or the placard is not designed in such a manner to accommodate hanging from a rearview mirror, the placard shall be displayed on the dashboard. Placards may also be issued for use in vehicles when operated for the use and benefit of persons with disabilities provided that a person with a disability is being transported in the vehicle. Organizations that transport persons with disabilities shall upon application be issued not more than eight placards in the organization's name. These placards may be used in a vehicle of the organization or the personal vehicle of an employee or volunteer of the organization when the employee or volunteer operates the vehicle for the benefit and use of persons with disabilities provided that a person with a disability is being transported in the vehicle.
(c) Health care provider's statement.--
(1) Any person applying for a special plate or parking placard for persons with disabilities must present a statement, certified by a physician, podiatrist, chiropractor, physician assistant or certified registered nurse practitioner licensed or certified to practice in this Commonwealth or in a contiguous state, that the person with a disability is disabled as provided in subsection (a).
(2) Any person applying for a renewal of registration of a special plate for persons with disabilities must comply with this subsection. Once a person with a disability has been duly certified by a physician, podiatrist, chiropractor, physician assistant or certified registered nurse
accorded to vehicles displaying the plate.
(d) Penalty.--Any person violating this section commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than $\$ 100$.
(e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
"Chiropractor." A chiropractor acting within the scope of practice contained in the act of December 16, 1986 (P.L.1646, No.188), known as the Chiropractic Practice Act.
"Podiatrist." A podiatrist acting within the scope of practice contained in the act of March 2, 1956 (1955 P.L.1206, No.375), known as the Podiatry Practice Act.]

Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read: § 1338.1. Special registration plate and parking placard for person with disability.
(a) Special registration plate.--
(1) (i) The owner of a vehicle may apply to the department for a disability registration plate if a physician certifies that the applicant or a member of the applicant's household is a person with a disability.
(ii) An organization that owns a vehicle may apply to the department for a disability registration plate for that vehicle if the organization certifies that the vehicle is used exclusively to transport persons with disabilities.
(2) A person with a disability is a person who has a physical impairment that permanently limits or impairs the ability to walk and who satisfies at least one of the following conditions:
(ii) An organization may apply to the department for a permanent parking placard if the organization certifies of the applicant's household is a person with a disability under subsection (a) (2). the department shall send notice that the applicant must resubmit proof that the organization uses the vehicle exclusively to transport persons with disabilities.
(b) Parking placard for person with disability.-(1) (i) A person may apply to the department for a permanent parking placard for a person with a disability if a physician certifies that the applicant or a member

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(5) A parking placard issued under this subsection is windshield rearview mirror such that it can be seen from both the front and the rear of the vehicle. If the vehicle does not have a rearview mirror, the parking placard shall be displayed on the dashboard so that it may be read by a person standing outside the vehicle on the driver's side. shall expire at the department's discretion but no later than 120 days from the date it is issued.
(3) The department may issue up to two parking placards to a person or up to eight parking placards to an organization.
(4) A parking placard shall be hung from the front
organization for which it was issued, and it may not be used by any other person or organization.
(6) The department shall ensure that the permanent parking placard, the temporary parking placard and the parking placard issued to an organization are different colors.
(7) The department may not charge a fee for the issuance or reissuance of a parking placard under this subsection, but it may charge a reasonable fee for replacement of a lost or damaged parking placard. (c) When disability registration plate or parking placard must be returned to department.--
(1) A disability registration plate shall be returned to the department within 30 days of the death of the person to whom it has been issued. During that 30 -day period, if another person operates the vehicle bearing the disability registration plate, that person may not park in a space designated for persons with disabilities.
(2) A disability parking placard shall become void upon the death of the person to whom it was issued, and it shall be returned to the department within ten days of the death of the person to whom it was issued. During that ten-day period, the placard may not be displayed and may not be used to park in a space designated for persons with disabilities.
(3) A disability parking placard shall be returned to the department when it expires.
(4) A disability parking placard shall be returned to the department when the person for whom or the organization for which it was issued no longer meets the qualifications for issuance of a placard, including, in the case of an
(f) False certification.--A physician who certifies that a person is a person with a disability under the provisions of subsection (a) (2) when that person does not meet the criteria commits a misdemeanor of the third degree. A first offense shall be punishable by a fine of $\$ 2,500$, a second offense shall be punishable by a fine of $\$ 5,000$, and a third or subsequent offense shall be punishable by a fine of $\$ 10,000$ and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days.
(g) Recertification.--
(1) Each disability registration plate shall be void on the date that the annual registration sticker next expires, and each person for whom the plate was issued shall apply to be recertified as a person with a disability in order for the plate to be valid and a new annual sticker to be issued.
(2) Each permanent disability parking placard shall be void on the next birthday of the person for whom it was issued, and each person shall apply to be recertified as a person with a disability in order for a new placard to be issued.
(3) The department shall give reasonable notice to each person of the requirement that the person be recertified as a person with a disability by the date that the registration plate or placard expires. Reasonable notice shall provide an amount of time sufficient for the person to be recertified as a person with a disability before the applicable expiration date.
(4) If a person with a disability registration plate fails to be recertified as a person with a disability, the department shall issue a standard registration plate to that person. If a person with a parking placard is not

[^0]recertified, the department shall require that any placard issued for that person is returned to the department.
(h) Violations.--Except as otherwise provided under this section, a violation of this section is a misdemeanor of the third degree. A first offense is punishable by a fine of $\$ 500$, a second offense is punishable by a fine of $\$ 1,000$ and a third or subsequent offense is punishable by a fine of $\$ 1,500$ and a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. (i) Regulations.--The department may adopt any rules or promulgate any regulations necessary to implement this section. Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.


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
