- 5 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society invested more than \$130
- million in research in 2001, \$25 million of which was used to
- fund research in this Commonwealth; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This investment in research is paying off, with more
- than 60% of cancer patients surviving; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Over the years and with funds raised from Daffodil
- Days, the American Cancer Society has made great strides in 11
- cancer research, including funding scientists who have 12
- 13 discovered the Pap test, bone marrow transplant techniques,

- 1 tamoxifen and Gleevec; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Thirty-two Nobel Prize winners were funded by the
- 3 American Cancer Society at some point in their career; and
- 4 WHEREAS, One in every two men and one in every three women
- 5 will develop cancer, therefore it is imperative for the American
- 6 Cancer Society to continue to expand flower sales and volunteer
- 7 participation in Daffodil Days so everyone can work together
- 8 toward a cancer-free society; therefore be it
