A RESOLUTION

- Urging the President and Congress of the United States to
- continue to fund the Small Business Administration Microloan Program, including the Women's Business Center Program, at
- 3
- 4 levels equal to or higher than the current budget.
- 5 WHEREAS, The Microcredit Summit has defined microcredit as
- programs extending small loans to very poor people for self-6
- 7 employment projects that generate income, allowing individuals
- 8 to care for themselves and their families; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Target users of these loans are microentrepreneurs
- 10 and low-income households; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The Association for Enterprise Opportunity and the
- 12 microenterprise development industry have defined a
- microenterprise as a business with five or fewer employees which 13
- 14 requires \$35,000 or less in start-up capital and which does not
- 15 have access to the traditional commercial banking sector; and
- 16 WHEREAS, According to the Pennsylvania Microenterprise
- Coalition, microenterprises account for 15.7% of all employment 17
- 18 in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There are 809,008 microenterprises and 32
- 2 microenterprise development programs in the Commonwealth of
- 3 Pennsylvania; and
- 4 WHEREAS, According to the coalition, microenterprise
- 5 development is a strong public investment with estimated returns
- 6 ranging from \$2.06 to \$2.72 for every dollar invested; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Microenterprise provides moderate-income and low-
- 8 income individuals, mostly women, an opportunity to create
- 9 successful family businesses; therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 11 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the President and Congress of
- 12 the United States to continue to fund the Small Business
- 13 Administration Microloan Program, including the Women's Business
- 14 Center Program, at levels equal to or higher than the current
- 15 budget; and be it further
- 16 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 17 the President of the United States, the presiding officers of
- 18 each house of Congress and to each member of Congress from
- 19 Pennsylvania.
